Risk Description (Description of the risk once it has been analysed)	Second wave of swine flu is expected to run from November to April. Government projections suggest that up to 12% of the population may be affected. This may impact on the Councils ability to deliver its objectives and ability to meet service expectations for the public. The council and its key partners must have appropriate plans in place to manage the negative impacts of this second wave
Risk Cause (What event or series of events must occur for the risk to transpire– consider internal and external factors)	1 Officers are not prepared for the level of absenteeism in their area 2 Services have not been prioritised in advance 3. Objectives and projects have not been prioritised in advance 4. Plans have not been tested to ensure that they would operate in the event of a pandemic 5. Crisis management plans are undeveloped and senior officers are not able to effectively and quickly make decisions 6 Spread of flu is not contained 7. Key partners are not prepared and are unable to deliver key services, projects or objectives
