

Application for variation in hackney carriage fares for 2006

Implementation Date early 2006

The present formula used to provide the relevant rates of inflation linked to hackney carriage fares in Oxford was agreed between Colta & Oxford City Council officials around fifteen years ago.

At that time, items included in the formula took into account *national* inflationary issues that were considered prudent of that era, however, nearly two decades later the mathematicians of that time could be excused for failing to give due consideration to *local* inflationary items such as...

- ..the 300% rise in the cost of a family home in Oxford during that time (an annual average rise of 20%).
- ..the 120% increase in rates/council tax during the same period (8% per year).
- ..Increase in the overall cost of an annual cab badge in Oxford increased by 35% in 2004/05.
- ..13% increase in 2005 for medical reports charged by GP's (now £90).

Without exception, under the present formula, the above listed local inflationary items are year on year absorbed by local badge holders & not discharged to the consumer as should be the case, in many ways this situation negates a large part of previously permitted annual increases in local hackney carriage fares, over a fifteen year period this has lead to a steady decline in the income of those working within the industry.

A further adverse effect of the manner in which the present formula has been applied, is that the inflationary figures that *are* taken into account are substantially out of date by the time they reach the metered fare i.e. the inflation linked increase in fares to take effect in January/February 2006 are calculated by the use of operating costs incurred throughout 2004, the problem has been compounded during 2005 by the sharp increase in diesel fuel (24% increase within the last 22 months), using the present formula this would result in only 9% of the additional fuel costs being recovered before 2007.

The above issues certainly highlight the need for a review in the way future tariff increases are calculated.

Additional evidence of the substantial decline in revenues & subsequent income of badge holders in Oxford over recent years, is contained within the *national league table* of hackney carriage fares (source November 2005 'Private Hire And Taxi Monthly' magazine).

Six years ago (1999), Oxford rated 88th from the top of the national league table of fares, in 2000 we dropped to 115th, in 2003 123rd, 2004 142nd to present standing at 166th, this is not only absolute evidence of a decline in income. the year that Oxford's hackney carriage fleet became 100% wheelchair accessible, it shows decline in income over many other towns & cities across the country.

Many of those 165 licensing authorities above Oxford still do not operate a mandatory wheelchair fleet, the cost of a new replacement *saloon* car suitable for use as a taxi prior to 1999, increased from around ten thousand pounds to over twenty five thousand for a purpose built cab, no additional allowance has ever been calculated into regular fare reviews where 'local' inflationary calculations have not been allowed.

The licensing authority now placed in Oxford's previous 88th position in the above table, now charge a daytime two mile fare of 4.70p (Oxford 4.40) & an unsocial hours fare over that distance of 7.05p (Oxford 5.80).

In the short term & in order that the fuel cost's incurred during 2005 do not further decline the income of Oxford's badge holders, &, pending an overall review of the way in which tariffs are re-calculated, it is necessary to consider an extension of the normal 'inflation period' to include 2005's fuel increases within the calculation for the 2006 tariffs, this would involve the calculation of inflation rates from January 2004 to September 2005, future years inflationary periods would then become September to September of each year.

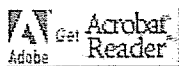
