

Street Trading – Little Clarendon Street

Result of Consultation Exercise

Following General Purposes Licensing Committees resolution on 4th January 2007, a consultation exercise was initiated with regard to designating Little Clarendon St a Consent Street for the purposes of street trading to allow farmers markets and other similar events to take place.

The consultation exercise took the form of advertising the proposed change in the Oxford Times and circulating copies of the proposal to the County Council Highways Service, Thames Valley Police and premises around Little Clarendon Street.

No written responses, either adverse or positive were received to this consultation exercise. However, when the information was being delivered to the premises around Little Clarendon Street, the verbal responses obtained were all positive. A phone call supporting the proposal was also received from Sobell House.

On this basis, General Purposes Licensing Committee are recommended to make a final determination as to whether Little Clarendon Street be designated as a “Consent Street” for the purposes of street trading.
