Title of Report: Update on Licensing Authority Activity March 2009 – August 2009

Summary and Recommendations

Purpose of report: To inform Committee of the progress made by the Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 between March 2009 – August 2009 in accordance with Policy GN10 of the Statement of Licensing Policy.

Recommendation(s):

The Committee is asked to note the contents of the report.

1. This report informs Committee of progress made by the Licensing Authority ("the Authority) under the duties of the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 between March 2009 – August 2009. Under Policy GN10 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, the Licensing Authority should report to the Committee on matters determined by Licensing Officers with delegated authority.
2. The report covers data on service volumes; details of Licensing hearing decisions; decisions made by Officers with delegated powers; information on Temporary Event Notices ("TENs") and enforcement activity.

3. The table below provides data on licence applications received during the period March 2009 – August 2009.

4. To date the Licensing Authority have processed; 1,101 Personal Licences; 800 New Premises Licences; 194 Variations on Premises Licences; 143 Premises Transfer Applications and 88 New and Variations of Club Certificates.

Applications Granted by the Licensing Authority

5. A hearing is not required where an application has been lawfully made and no Responsible Authority or Interested Party has made a representation. There were 19 licences issued by the Licensing Officers under delegated authority, details are listed in Appendix 1.

Temporary Event Notices

6. Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is a notification given by an individual to Oxford City Council giving notice of an event that is to take place. Temporary Event Notices relate to temporary events with less than 500 attendees where 'licensable activities' are planned to take place.

Attached in Appendix 2 is a list of TENs applied for between March 09 – August 09.

Representations and Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings

7. When Relevant Representations are received from Interested Parties or Responsible Authorities then the application is determined at a Licensing Sub-Committee Hearing.
8. Relevant Representations were received for 13 applications for

Premises Licenses and Club Certifications, resulting in hearings. Representations were made as follows:

The details of these applications and decisions of the hearings are attached in Appendix 3.

Reviews of Licensed Premises

9. Under the 2003 Act it is possible for the Authority to review a Premises Licence at any time if a representation is received from a Responsible Authority or an Interested Party. The Authority has no powers to initiate its own review. Reviews may only arise in connection with a failure or failures in the premises connected to the licensing objectives.
10. Between March 2009 and August 2009 there were 2 applications for Premises Licence Reviews that were determined by the Licensing Committee Moods and Westgate Stores. The details of these reviews can be found in Appendix 4.

Appeals under the Licensing Act 2003

11. The Licensing Authority received applications for appeal from **Moods** (George Street) and **Westgate Stores** (Botley Road).

Both applicants are appealing the decision made by The Licensing and Gambling Acts Committee as a result of their review hearings. The reviews were initiated by Thames Valley Police on the basis of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm at the premises. The appeals will be heard on the 9th of October at Oxford Magistrates Court.

Enforcement Activity

12. Between March 2009 and August 2009, the two Licensing Officers have made:
 - 87 Inspections on Premises
 - Issued 32 warning letters to premises for breaches of premises licence conditions (predominantly for licences not displayed on the premises and noise complaints)
13. A joint test-purchasing operation with Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority took place on the 1st July 2009. The results are shown in the table below:

Nightsafe

14. The Licensing Authority fully supports and participates in Nightsafe activities. This includes intelligence sharing and 2 monthly joint inspections with the Police, Fire Authority and Trading Standards. Approximately 6 premises are visited during an operation alternating between Oxford City Centre and East Oxford.

Sub-Committee Hearings**1. The Bridge, 6-9 Hythe Bridge Street, Oxford, OX1 2EW – 16th April 2009**

Application to vary premises licence 08/00272/RVPREM. Extension of hours for licensable activities on Wednesday night/Thursday morning from 02.00 hrs to 03.00 hrs.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral.

Having considered all the evidence before it, and taking into account the Special Saturation Policy for this area, the Sub Committee decided that the application was for a material variation that would add to the cumulative impact. The Sub Committee felt the application did not contain any measures to combat the likely increase in nuisance, crime and disorder and as the Applicants were not present to expand on their application they could not be satisfied that the variation sought would not add significantly to these problems. Therefore the Sub Committee REFUSED the application.

2. Baby Simple, 213 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX4 1XF – 16th April 2009

Application to vary premises licence 06/00341/TRPREM. To rectify error to reflect original hours as per P.E.L (Public Entertainment Licence). Removal of redundant conditions 4 and 5. To amend condition 7 to reflect present capacity and risk assessment.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral. Members of the Sub Committee considered Policy GN19 (Special Saturation Policy for East Oxford) and policy LH3 (licensing hours not to be limited) and decided that the Applicant had held a Special Hours Certificate and would have been entitled to operate the varied hours sought as of right under "grandfather rights" if he had applied correctly at the time of conversion, in any event he had been operating the extended hours in good faith since that time. Therefore, there could be no significant increase in crime and disorder by allowing the variation and it would be unreasonable to refuse it because of what appeared to have been a genuine mistake.

Because, since the time of conversion, there had been a general increase in crime and disorder in the East Oxford area it was necessary to attach the new conditions proposed by the police to the licence. The Sub Committee considered the Applicant's resistance to condition CD48 (high visibility clothing) but decided not to amend that condition as it was important that door staff were clearly identifiable inside and outside the premises. However, a prohibition on serving Champagne in bottles was not proportionate and condition CD20 (bottle prohibition) would be amended to allow Champagne in bottles to be served.

The Application was otherwise in accordance with the licensing objectives.

The amended application is therefore granted as applied for, the sale of alcohol on both the ground floor and the first floor shall be from 10.00 hours to 00.00 hours on Monday to Wednesday and from 10.00 hours to 01.00 hours Thursday to Saturday,

and from 12.00 hours to 00.00 hours on Sunday and from 12.00 to 00.00 on Good Fridays.

Late night refreshments may be served from 23.00 hours to 01.00 hours on Thursday to Saturday, and from 23.00 hours to 00.00 hours on Sunday to Wednesday. Existing conditions 4 and 5 are deleted from the licence

The following additional conditions shall be attached to the licence:-

- A minimum of 2 Door Supervisors, all individually registered with the Security Industry Authority, shall be on the premises at all times from 21.00 until the premises is cleared of customers and shut on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturdays.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- All staff shall be suitably trained for their job function for the premises. The training shall be written into a programme, ongoing and under constant review, and must be available to a relevant Responsible Authority when called upon.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- No person shall be admitted to the premises less than one hour before cessation of the last licensable activity.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- Upon completion of a crime survey by Thames Valley Police the Licence Holder shall act accordingly with the recommendations of the survey.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exit points to advise customers that the premises fall within an Alcohol Free Zone.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- The premises shall be cleared of customers and closed 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last licensed activity.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- A Premises Daily Register shall be kept at the premises. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register should record:-
- The name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day;
- All calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti social behaviour by persons attending or leaving the premises. This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of the call and the time and date of the incident about which the call is made and any actions taken to deal with the call;
- Name, SIA number, start and finish times of any door staff on duty that night;

- Any refusals on grounds of age and/or intoxication;
- (This will include, date, time member of staff involved and a brief physical description of the person refused)
- Any use of force by door supervisors or staff in ejecting persons from the premises;
- Any searches carried out by door staff and any seizures.
- The Premises Daily Register will be readily available for inspection by a member of Thames Valley police or the licensing authority upon request.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- The Licence Holder shall implement a written responsible drinking policy to be agreed in writing with Thames Valley Police.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder / prevention of public nuisance.

- No drinks shall be served in bottles except Champagne served with accompanying glasses.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- No person shall be allowed to leave the premises whilst in the possession of any drinking vessel or open glass bottle, whether empty or containing any beverage.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- No outside area shall be used for consumption of alcohol or provision of Regulated Entertainment unless the area is clearly marked or defined.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder / prevention of public nuisance. .

- In order to promote the prevention of crime and disorder objective, the maximum number of persons (including staff and entertainers) allowed at the premises shall not exceed 150 persons for the whole premises.
- The door supervisors or staff on duty will operate a means of counting customers in and out so the capacity limit is not exceeded at any point.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- All members of staff at the premises shall seek "credible photographic proof of age evidence" from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years and who is seeking access to the premises or is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence, or Proof of Age card carrying a "PASS" logo.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder and protection of children from harm.

- Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and in a suitable location at any points of sale, advising customers that they may be asked to produce evidence of their age.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder and protection of children from harm.

- Alcoholic drinks shall not be supplied in such a way which will enable persons to consume unlimited quantities of alcoholic drinks on payment of a single payment.
- The premises will not operate any drinks promotions or retail drinks at a discount that allows customers to purchase alcohol below the average retail price.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- The Licence Holder shall implement a written Drugs Policy. This shall details the strategies to minimise the use and supply of illegal drugs within the premises. The Drugs Policy shall include a structured training programme covering the issues relevant to the misuse of drugs in relation to licensed premises, to include clear guidance on a procedure for the confiscation of illegal substances from patrons and this training will be delivered to all staff. This Policy shall be approved in writing by Thames Valley Police.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- The premises will operate a policy of searching patrons wishing to enter (or if appropriate re-entering the premises). This policy will be in writing and approved by Thames Valley Police. The premises will have door supervisors of both sexes on duty to facilitate this policy. All searches will be documented in the premises register.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- All Door Supervisors will wear "High Visibility Florescent yellow Clothing" at all time when on duty both inside and outside the premise.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder.

- The Licence Holder shall implement a written queue management policy. All queuing outside the premises shall be managed in such a way that prevents noisy or rowdy behaviour and therefore minimises disturbance or nuisance to neighbours. The policy shall be approved in writing by the Licensing Authority.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder / prevention of public nuisance.

- The Licence Holder shall implement a written dispersal policy, to move customers from the premises and the immediate vicinity in such a way as to cause minimum disturbance or nuisance to neighbours, both residential and business, and to make the minimum impact upon the neighbourhood in relation to potential nuisance, antisocial behaviour, crime and disorder. The policy shall be approved in writing by the Licensing Authority.

Reason: prevention of crime and disorder / prevention of public nuisance.

The Sub Committee noted that, unless removed or replaced by this decision, the existing conditions on the Premises Licence would continue to apply.

3. Gardeners Arms, 39 Plantation Road, Oxford, OX2 6JE – 5th May 2009

Application to vary premises licence for additional regulated entertainment of films and plays.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral. Members of the Sub Committee felt that in light of the evidence from the interested parties it was necessary to amend some of the existing conditions in order to prevent problems of noise nuisance. The measures suggested by the applicant, and the amendments to the application were otherwise sufficient to meet the licensing objectives. The amended application was therefore GRANTED subject to the following conditions:-

- The exhibition of films may take place indoors in the back room of the premises only between the hours of 12.00 and 23.00, on any day of the week.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance.

- All ground floor windows and doors shall be closed by 22.00 hours on any night when regulated entertainment is taking place, and shall be kept closed during the entertainment, except for access and egress.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance.

(This condition replaces condition 14. on the existing licence)

- Regulated entertainment shall be held only in the rear room of the premises and an acoustic curtain shall be fitted, where practicable, to the doors and windows in that room.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance.

(This condition replaces condition 17 on the existing licence)

The Sub Committee noted that the other existing conditions on the Premises Licence would continue to apply.

4. The Mission Mexican Grill, 2 King Edward Street, Oxford, OX1 4HS – 5th May 2009

New Premises Licence application for use of the ground floor and basement restaurant approx 75sqm with 48 seats. Application for recorded music and sale of alcohol from 11.00 hrs to 23.00 hrs Sunday to Saturday.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took all submissions and evidence presented into account. They were mindful that the premises fall within the area of the Special Saturation Policy (SSP) for Oxford City Centre, but felt that in the absence of any representation from the Police and because the proposed premises was a restaurant, the application would not add to the problems of cumulative impact and that therefore the application could be granted with the following conditions:-

The premises shall operate as a restaurant only. Alcohol shall be served only to people who are taking a meal at the premises and their guests, or to people who have ordered a meal or are waiting to order a meal.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance/prevention of crime and disorder.

5. Café Tarifa , 56-60 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX4 1JB - 5th May – 2009

Application to vary premises licence 07/00990/PREM. To add the activity of live music (mainly acoustic), both amplified and non amplified. To add the provision of facilities to make music and to dance.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral. The Sub Committee noted that a number of conditions had been agreed between the Applicant and Thames Valley Police, and that further conditions had been agreed during the hearing. The Sub Committee considered policies GN19 (Saturation Policy) and GN23 (Live Music) of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

The Sub Committee concluded that the amended application, with the agreed conditions attached, would not add to the problems of cumulative impact. It was confirmed that the conditions agreed with the Police were necessary and should be applied. Members of the Sub Committee therefore felt that the measure suggested by the applicant, and the application as amended, were sufficient to meet the licensing objectives.

The amended application was GRANTED for,

Live music and the provision of facilities for making music between the following hours:

- Sunday to Thursday – 12.00hrs to 23.00hrs
- Friday and Saturday – 12.00hrs to 20.00hrs.

subject to the following additional conditions:-

- When the Premises is open for the sale of alcohol, no persons under 18 shall be admitted to, or allowed to remain on the premises between 21:00 hrs and 06:00 hrs, unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

Reason: The protection of children from harm.

- A Premises Daily Register shall be kept at the premises. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register should record:-
- The name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day.
- All calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti social behaviour by persons attending or leaving the premises. This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of the call and the time and date of the incident about which the call is made and any actions taken to deal with the call.

- Use of force by door supervisors/staff in ejecting persons from the premises (to include date time member of staff that refused and brief physical description of the person concerned)
- Any refusals on grounds of age or intoxication. (To include date time member of staff that refused and brief physical description of the person concerned)
- The Premises Daily Register will be readily available for inspection by an Authorised Person throughout the trading hours of the premise.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder/ prevention of public nuisance.

- The premises shall be cleared of customers and closed 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last licensed activity.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance]

- No person shall be allowed to leave the premises on to any public space (this does not include the rear garden) whilst in the possession of any drinking vessel or open glass bottle, whether empty or containing any beverage.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder

- All members of staff at the premises shall seek "credible photographic proof of age evidence" from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years and who is seeking access to the premises or is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence, or Proof of Age card carrying a "PASS" logo.

Reason: The protection of children from harm.

- Alcoholic drinks shall not be supplied in such a way which will enable persons to consume unlimited quantities of alcoholic drinks on payment of a single payment.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder.

- The premises shall implement a written policy to manage those patrons wishing to smoke directly outside the premises to ensure they are not causing nuisance on the public highway.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance

- Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exit points to advise customers that the premises fall within an Alcohol Free Zone.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder/ prevention of public nuisance

- The format of the venue and/or the layout of furniture within areas used by customers shall not undergo substantial change without the prior written consent of Thames Valley Police

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder/ prevention of public nuisance.

- No outside area shall be used for the consumption of alcohol or the provision of regulated entertainment after 23.00 hours each day.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance.

- All management and core full time staff shall undergo certificated conflict resolution training within six months of this hearing (May 5th 2009) Part time staff shall be given "in house" training and have an awareness of the venue's policy on conflict resolution.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder.

6. Kentucky Friend Chicken, 140 Cowley Road, OX4 IJJ – 21st May 2009

Application to vary premises licence 05/01255/PREM: To increase the hours of trading so as to allow the premises to remain open until 04.00 hrs daily.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral. They considered policies GN19 (Special Saturation Policy) and PP10 (Late Night Refreshment) of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. The Sub Committee decided that, in this case, the Special Saturation Policy was not engaged as the premises did not sell alcohol. The Police evidence did disclose problems of crime and disorder in the vicinity, and the conditions and amended hours suggested by Thames Valley Police were therefore necessary and sufficient to allow the application to meet the four licensing objectives.

The application was therefore GRANTED for:

Provision of late night refreshment: Sunday to Thursday 23.00 hours to 02.00 hours, Friday and Saturday 23.00 hours to 03.00 hours.

and subject to the following additional conditions :-

7. Carne, 212 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX4 1UQ – 28th May 2009

Variation of premises licence 08/01058/PREM: Restaurant main function is serving food and beverage. There is occasional live entertainment during Friday and Saturdays. Restaurant area is segregated from bar area. The bar is situated at the front of the restaurant. Variation is to provide refreshment, for our restaurant clients, in a controlled and relaxed environment. Due to feedback clients seek other venues after we close but would prefer to stay due to difficulty getting in other places and rowdiness of such venues. Looking to extend licensable activities (Sale of alcohol, late night refreshment and recorded music) until 02.00 hrs Monday to Saturday.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral. They considered policies GN19 (Special Saturation Policy) and PP10 (Late Night Refreshment) of the Council’s Statement of Licensing Policy. The Sub Committee decided that, in this case, the Special Saturation Policy was not engaged as the premises did not sell alcohol. The Police evidence did disclose problems of crime and disorder in the vicinity, and the conditions and amended hours suggested by Thames Valley Police were therefore necessary and sufficient to allow the application to meet the four licensing objectives.

The application was therefore GRANTED for:

Provision of late night refreshment: Sunday to Thursday 23.00 hours to 02.00 hours, Friday and Saturday 23.00 hours to 03.00 hours.

and subject to the following additional conditions :-

8. White Horse, 1 London Road, Headington, Oxford, OX3 7SP – 25th June 2009

Application to vary Premises Licence 05/00987/PREM: To vary the following: Late Night Refreshment: Sunday to Thursday (inclusive) 23:00pm to 00.30am/Friday and Saturday (inclusive) 23:00pm to 01:00am, Sale by retail of alcohol: Sunday to Thursday (inclusive) 09:00am to 00:30am/ Friday and Saturday (inclusive) 09:00am to 01:00am, hours open to the public: Sunday to Thursday (inclusive) 09:00am to 01:00am/ Friday to Saturday (inclusive) 09:00am to 01:30am. To remove the following condition: No person under the age of 18 shall be admitted to or allowed to remain on the premises after 20.00 hours. To be amended to: No person under the age of 18 shall be admitted to or allowed to remain on the premises after 20;00 hours unless in the dining area of the premises when no person under the age of 18 will be admitted or allowed to remain on the premises after 22:00 hours.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee concluded that as the amended application did not now seek any later operating hours the licensing objectives of preventing public nuisance and preventing crime and disorder would not be compromised by allowing the variation.

As the variation to Condition 3 would allow children to remain at the premises until a later hour the Sub Committee felt that it was necessary in the interests of protecting children from harm to attach certain new conditions to the licence. The Sub Committee reached this decision in light of the Police representation and having considered policy CH2 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.

The Sub Committee decided not to impose the condition sought by the Police regarding restriction on changes to the layout of the interior of the premises as there was no evidence indicating the need for such a condition.

The amended application was GRANTED allowing the sale of alcohol to start at 09.00 each day and varying *Condition 3* of the Licence to read as follows:

No person under the age of 18 shall be admitted or allowed to remain on the premises after 20.00 hours except in the dining area of the premises where no person under 18 shall be admitted or allowed to remain after 22.00 hours.

The Licence will be subject to the following new conditions:-

- All staff shall be suitably trained for their job function at the premise. this will include all staff being made aware of the law regarding the refusal of service to any person who is drunk or is underage, and instruction on how to seek identification from anyone who appears to be underage.
- The training shall be written into a programme, ongoing and under constant review, and must be available to a relevant Responsible Authority when called upon.

Reason: protection of children from harm

- The Licence Holder shall implement a written Children's Policy. This policy shall include the steps the premises will implement to prevent persons under 18 years of age gaining access to the main bar or gaining access to alcohol without a table meal.

Reason: Protection of children from harm.

- A Premises Daily Register shall be kept at the premise. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register should record:
the name of the person responsible for the premise on each given day.
all calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti social behaviour by persons attending or leaving the premises. This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of the call and the time and date of the incident about which the call is made and any actions taken to deal with the call.
Names, SIA numbers and start and finish times of all Door staff working that day.

Any use of force by staff/door staff in ejecting persons from the premises (to include date, time, persons involved and a brief physical description of the person(s) ejected)

Any refusals on grounds of age/intoxication (to include date, time member of staff that refused and a brief physical description of the person refused)

The Premises Daily Register will be readily available for inspection by an Authorised Person throughout the trading hours of the premise.

Reason: Protection of children from harm.

- All members of staff at the premises shall seek "credible photographic proof of age evidence" from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years and who is seeking access to the premises or is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence, or Proof of Age card carrying a "PASS" logo.

Reason: Protection of children from harm.

9. Russian House, 84 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX4 1JB – 25th June 2009

Premises Licence. Application for a New Premises Licence for Russia House, 84 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX3 1JB. The Premises is a restaurant with seating for approximately 45 people. A Bar is going to be installed within the Restaurant and there shall be a fully fitted kitchen at the rear of the premises and a freezer and store room at the very back of the premises. Ladies toilets, gents toilets and a separate staff toilet are provided with hand wash basins and drying facilities. A full fire alarm and emergency lighting system are provided. Waiter/Waitress service is provided to the tables and full dishwashing/drying services shall be incorporated within the kitchen area. The premises is of single storey on ground floor with a frontage onto Cowley Road. Activities sought are Recorded music, Late night refreshment and sale of alcohol from 12.00 hours until 00.00 midnight Sunday to Wednesday and until 01.00 hours on Thursday to Saturday.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub-Committee took all submissions and evidence presented into account. They found that the proposed premises fell within the area of the Special Saturation Policy (SSP) for East Oxford (Policy GN19 of the Statement of Licensing Policy) and so the SSP was engaged. They also took into account policy PP1 (Restaurants).

As the proposed licence would effectively replace a previous licence held for greater licensable activities at the site it was unlikely to result in any increase to cumulative impact.

Also the application was for a small restaurant with conditions attached which were far more stringent than would normally be expected of premises of this type and would ensure that the premises remained a restaurant only.

Because of these factors the Sub Committee found that the application could be granted without any increase to crime and disorder or cumulative impact.

The application was otherwise in accordance with the licensing objectives.

The application was GRANTED with all the conditions previously agreed with police to be attached.

10. Purple Turtle, Frewin Court, Oxford – 16th July 2009

Application to vary Premises Licence 05/00992/PREM: To extend the terminal hour for existing licensable activities until 04.00 following on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays (with the consequent amendment to the closure of the premises to 04:30 on those days). To vary condition 9 annex 2 of the conditions on the licence to provide as set out in the draft amended condition served with this application, to provide for greater flexibility depending on the capacity in the premises. Condition amended to read: A minimum of 3 door supervisors all individually registered with SIA shall be on the premises at all times between 21:00 hours and until closing time on Fridays and Saturdays when licensable activities continue after 00:00 midnight. On Sundays to Thursdays, SIA door supervisors shall be on the premises at all times between 21:00 and closing depending on the following capacities (being calculated accordingly to the total of patrons, staff and/or entertainers in the premises):

Maximum capacity of 120	1 SIA door supervisor minimum
Between 120 and 200	2 SIA door supervisor minimum
Between 200 and full capacity (360)	3 SIA door supervisor minimum

Capacity numbers shall be monitored at 1/2 hourly intervals from 20:30 onwards during the entire evening, until closure. If the capacity increases, resulting in the required minimum number of door supervisors increasing from 1 to 2, and/or from 2 to 3, the premises shall be manned by the higher number of required SIA door supervisors without delay and further, that increased number of SIA supervisors shall remain at the premises for the remainder of that particular night, whether or not the capacity then reduces again.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

THE APPLICATION WAS WITHDRAWN BY THE APPLICANT.

11. Kukui, 42 Park End Street, Oxford, OX1 1JN – 6th August 2009

Application to vary Premises licence 09/00025/RVPREM. Extension of hours for the sale of alcohol, provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment on each Friday and Saturday until 03.30 hours (morning following) and Sundays until 02.00 hours (morning following).

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral. It also considered both the Government Guidance under section 182 of the Act and the City Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy (SLP) in particular paras 10.19 & 10.20 of the Guidance (Hours of Trading) and Policy G19 of the SLP (Special Saturation Policy (SSP)).

In order to promote the licensing objective of preventing crime & disorder the Sub Committee **REFUSED** the Application for the following reasons:

The Sub Committee found that the variation sought was a 'material variation' as, taking into account the evidence of Thames Valley Police and that contained in the background evidence to the SSP, the Premises is in an area of existing high levels of crime and disorder and the variation sought was likely to add to those problems.

Therefore, In accordance with the SSP, there is a presumption against granting the application.

The evidence of the Applicant that the Premises had operated without significant incidents on a number of late (TENS) events was encouraging but not sufficient to rebut the presumption against granting the application.

The premises licence having been reviewed on 26/02/09 on grounds of crime and disorder, the Sub Committee felt that insufficient time had passed since resolution of the review to establish whether the additional conditions added to the licence then were having any effect on reducing crime and disorder. The number of incidents reported to police since the review indicated continuing problems at the premises and the Sub Committee was satisfied that allowing later hours at this stage was likely to add to an already existing problem.

The Sub committee considered whether any new conditions could be added to the licence to allow the variation to be granted without compromising the licensing objectives but decided that the licence was already heavily conditioned and no new conditions were likely to have an effect.

12. Midcounties Co-operative, 40-43 Walton Street, Oxford, OX2 6AD - 27th August 2009

Application to vary Premises Licence 05/01258/PREM: Extension to existing hours permitted by the Premises Licence during which alcohol can be supplied. Hours sought are 07.00 hrs until 00.00 midnight Sunday to Saturday.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

THE APPLICATION WAS WITHDRAWN BY THE APPLICANT

13. The Ashmolean Museum, Beaumont Street, Oxford, OX1 2PH - 27th August 2009

New Premises Licence application: The Ashmolean Museum is in a prime city centre location on Beaumont Street and houses Oxford University's collection of Art and Archaeology. The premises comprise lower ground, ground and upper ground, 1st, 2nd and 3rd floors as well as a forecourt and a terrace on the third floor - as shown in the plans. It is a free Museum and includes a shop in the same building. It is also a spectacular venue for entertaining private and corporate guests.

Application is for various licensable activities from 08.00 hours until 00.00 midnight, Late night refreshment 23.00 hours until 00.00 midnight and sale of alcohol from 12.00 hours until 00.00 midnight. All are for Sunday to Saturday. After 21:30 regulated entertainment shall not take place outside on the terrace or the forecourt.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub-Committee considered all the submissions and evidence presented. They considered the government guidance made under section 182 of the Licensing Act and the Oxford City Council Statement of licensing Policy in particular policies LH3 (licensing hours not limited), GN19 Special Saturation Policy (SSP) for the City Centre, LH5 (closing times) and LA5 (addressing local concerns).

The Sub Committee took into account the unique nature of premises and proposed licensable activities. They found that because the licence would to some extent be a replacement for an already existing licence and that the application had now been amended to prevent regulated entertainment outside after 21.30, the risk of public

nuisance was minimal and granting the application was unlikely to significantly add to *cumulative impact* in the city centre or compromise the Special Saturation Policy.

The Sub Committee considered the proposal of the interested parties that a decibel limit and prohibition on loud speakers be imposed. However, they found that the concerns over noise nuisance were largely speculation at this stage and in the absence of any evidence as to what an appropriate decibel level would be, no conditions of this sort could be considered necessary. The Sub Committee noted that if noise nuisance did become a problem residents could seek a review of the licence.

The Sub Committee were satisfied that in order promote the licensing objective of preventing public nuisance and make the 21.30 restriction volunteered by the Applicant effective, two conditions were necessary and would be imposed:

1. When regulated entertainment is taking place in the Restaurant, all external doors and windows to the Terrace area must be kept closed after 21.30, other than for access and egress.
Reason: prevention of public nuisance.
2. The Premises shall be cleared of customers and closed 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last licensed activity.
Reason: prevention of public nuisance.

The amended application was otherwise in accordance with the licensing objectives and was GRANTED.

Reviews of Premises Licenses/ Club Premises Certificates

1. Mood Music Cocktail Bar, 29-31 George Street, Oxford.
Hearing - 5th May 2009

Thames Valley Police applied for a review of this licence under the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, and public safety issues.

Following a review of the licence in March 2008, applied for by Thames Valley Police, certain conditions were added to the licence following concerns over violent incidents at the venue. These were agreed by the licence holder and licensing committee.

Thames Valley Police have evidence that these conditions have not been adhered to and that violent incidents are occurring as a result.

Having taken all the representations into account the Sub Committee decided the licence should be revoked.

2. Westgate Stores, 1 Botley Road, Oxford.
Hearing - 28th May 2009

Thames Valley Police do not believe the premises is adhering to their responsibilities under the protection of children from harm objective of the Licensing Act 2003.

Local neighbourhood officers are having to tackle groups of youths they are discovering in public places in the vicinity, drinking alcohol that they believe has been obtained from the premises. The shop has on three separate occasions since August 2008 sold alcohol to youths, as witnessed by TVP and Trading Standards.

Despite these issues being brought to the attention of the DPS on numerous occasions and advice on how to deal with this problem have been provided the premises has repeatedly failed to uphold their legal and social responsibilities, and as a result of this is a contributing factor to the antisocial behaviour in the Botley Road area of the City.

Having taken all the representations into account the Sub Committee decided the licence should be revoked.
