Title of Report: Update on Licensing Authority Activity
April 2010 - August 2010

Summary and Recommendations

Purpose of report: To inform Committee of the progress made by the Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 between April 2010 and August 2010.

Recommendation(s):

The Committee recommended to

(i) note the contents of the report, and

(ii) make comments and recommendations regarding the future work of the Licensing Function.

1. This report informs Committee of progress made by the Licensing Authority ("the Authority") under the duties of the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 between April 2010 – August 2010. The Committee will have noted the contents of previous Updates during the period April 2009 – March 2010. Under Policy GN10 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, the Licensing Authority should report to the Committee on matters determined by the Head of Environmental Development with delegated authority.
2. The report covers data on service volumes; details of Licensing hearing decisions; decisions made under delegated powers; information on Temporary Event Notices ("TENs") and enforcement activity.

3. There are no financial requirements for consideration contained within this report.
4. The table below provides data on licence applications received and processed during the period April 2010 to August 2010, and the totals for this period.

5. To date the Licensing Authority has processed; 1,203 Personal Licences; 836 New Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates; 228 Variations on Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates; 451 Premises Transfer Applications.

Applications Granted by the Licensing Authority

6. A hearing is not required where an application has been lawfully made and no Responsible Authority or Interested Party has made a representation. 36 licences in this category were issued by the Head of Environmental Development under delegated authority, details are listed in **Appendix 1**.

Temporary Event Notices

7. A Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is a notification given by an individual to Oxford City Council giving notice of an event that is to take place. Only the Police can object to a TEN. If, as in most cases, there is no objection and the application does not exceed the maximum number of events in a year, the TEN is simply acknowledged and returned to the applicant. Should the Police object then the TEN will go to a hearing.
8. Temporary Event Notices relate to temporary events with less than 500 attendees where 'licensable activities' are planned to take place. Attached in **Appendix 2** is a list of the 294 TENs applied for between April 2010 – August 2010.

Representations and Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings

9. When Relevant Representations are received from Interested Parties or Responsible Authorities then the application is determined at a Licensing Sub-Committee Hearing.
10. Relevant Representations were received for 12 Premises Licence and Club Premises Certificate applications processed during April 2010 – August 2010. This resulted in 7 of the applications being determined by hearings (details of which are attached as **Appendix 3**).

Reviews of Licensed Premises

12. Under the 2003 Act it is possible for the Authority to review a Premises Licence at any time if a representation is received from a Responsible Authority or an Interested Party. The Authority has no powers to initiate its own review. Reviews may only arise in connection with a failure or failures in the premises connected to the licensing objectives.
13. Between April 2010 and August 2010 there were 3 applications for Premises Licence Reviews all applied for by Thames Valley Police.
14. Representations were received from 2 Interested Parties supporting the Police in one of the Review applications.

Appeals under the Licensing Act 2003

15. The Licensing Authority received notification from the Magistrates' Court of 2 appeals lodged by applicants.
16. The first appeal was lodged by the applicant for Drinks R Us, and the matter was directed back to the Licensing Sub-Committee to be heard on 12th August 2010 to redetermine due to the applicant making necessary amendments to his application that would uphold the licensing objectives. The application was subsequently granted and details can be found within **Appendix 3**.
17. The second appeal was lodged by Tesco Stores Ltd for their application to sell alcohol off the premises at 75 St Aldates. The appeal will be heard on 30th September 2010. The grounds for appeal are that the applicant strongly disagrees with the reasoning of the Licensing Sub-Committee who refused the original application.

Enforcement Activity

18. Between April 2010 and August 2010, the Licensing Team members have instigated:

- 100 Inspections of premises
- Issued 52 warning letters to businesses or licence holders for breaches of premises licence conditions. These have been predominantly for licences not displayed on the premises, noise complaints, or perceived poor management of premises.

Comment. The number of warnings issued has markedly increased due to (i) a procedural change and (ii) a more proactive approach to safeguarding the public. The Licensing Team now undertake all initial actions when dealing with complaints. Previously the complaint had been passed to the relevant responsible authority in the first instance, and as a result this led to delays and in sometimes the loss of opportunity for early licensing enforcement.

- On 16th April 2010, 30th April 2010, 9th May 2010 and 25th June 2010, the Licensing Team carried out enforcement of late night venues. A total of 50 premises were visited. Some minor problems were found during these late night visits that resulted in further enforcement action being taken to rectify matters found. These operations will be carried out monthly, covering the various areas of the District. Premises visited are determined on historical data and present intelligence.

19. Between April 2010 – August 2010, joint test-purchasing operations with Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority took place on 5 occasions. 43 premises were targeted during the operations, and 9 of the premises failed the test purchase operation.

20. Of those that failed the Test Purchase Operations, Thames Valley Police have made 3 applications for Reviews of the Premises Licences (**the results of which are attached in Appendix 3**), 4 fixed penalty notices were issued by the Police at the premises, and on 5 occasions the Designated Premises Supervisor (who failed the Test Purchase) was reported for potential prosecution.

Nightsafe

21. The NightSafe initiative contributes to the licensing objectives. This includes intelligence sharing with the Police, Fire Authority and Trading Standards. 10 premises were visited during an operation in Oxford City Centre on 3rd June 2010. Some very minor issues were found during these inspections with 4 of the premises, and were followed up and resolved immediately afterwards.

22. Following advice from the NightSafe Manager, it is understood that the

Home Office funding for NightSafe activity has ceased.

23. The Licensing Team has invited the NightSafe Manager to attend our own Enforcement visits in order to benefit from her knowledge and to provide for close agency partnership working.

Future Work

24. The Licensing Team will alternate late night enforcement between the City Centre late night venues, and premises located throughout the District. Premises located away from the City Centre will be visited because of complaints received by the Team, or from historical data that indicates that the way a premises has been managed leads to the need for it to be inspected.
25. The Team will carry out joint enforcement visits with members of the Environmental Protection Team and Nightsafe Manager in order to help gather evidence that may lead to reviews or prosecutions of problem premises.
26. The Licensing Authority have looked at alternative ways in which Test Purchase Operations can be carried out, and will be attending any operations undertaken by Thames Valley Police Area Sergeants.
27. A discussion forum (City Centre Late Night Partnership) with the City Centre licensees, the Licensing Team, Thames Valley Police and the City Centre Manager has been formed. The purpose of the forum is to identify the business needs of the licensees, to help promote a united approach to tackling the problems associated with those consuming alcohol and the effects of those persons when dispersing from a City Centre, and attracting new development to Oxford.
28. As the City Centre Late Night Partnership grows, other internal and external agencies will be brought in to the partnership in order that not only alcohol related issues, but also social issues are addressed.
29. The Licensing Team will be actively engaged with all Neighbourhood Action Groups, Residents Associations, and Business Links to help promote the whole of the District as a safe place for people to live and work, and provide initiatives on how to resolve issues through open forums and proactive enforcement.

Sub-Committee Hearings

1. Drinks R Us, 76 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX4 1JB

22nd April 2010

Application for a New Premises Licence: Sale of alcohol (off sales only) 10am – 11pm Monday to Wednesday, 10am – Midnight Thursday - Sunday.

Decision and Reasons of the Sub Committee

The Sub Committee took all representations into account, both written and oral. The Sub Committee considered the relevant government guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in particular policies LH8 (hours for off sales) and GN19 (East Oxford Special Saturation Policy (SSP)) it noted the conditions that had been agreed with the Police.

The Sub Committee found that given the stated name of the premises, *Drinks R Us*, and the indications given by the Applicant on the store layout, the intention appeared to be that alcohol rather than grocery sales would be the predominant use. This was contrary to one of the conditions agreed with Police.

The proposed premises fall within the area of the SSP for East Oxford and notwithstanding being an off licence rather than a pub or club would nevertheless create a new premises selling alcohol during the day and late at night. The SSP therefore provided a presumption against granting the application.

The Sub Committee considered the merits of the application and the measures proposed by the Applicant to promote the licensing objectives, including the conditions agreed with Thames Valley Police. However, the Sub Committee felt there was insufficient in the Applicants case to convince it that the premises would not add to the problems of disorder and street drinking in the area.

Balancing the application against the concerns of the Interested Parties and the clear aims of the SSP the Sub Committee found that another premises retailing alcohol throughout the day and late into the night would add to cumulative impact and the Applicant had not demonstrated that he could prevent this. **The application was therefore refused.**

2. Tesco Stores Ltd, 75 St Aldates, Oxford, OX1 1RA

3rd June 2010

Application for a New Premises Licence: Sale of alcohol (off sales only) 6am – 11pm Sunday to Saturday.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub-Committee took all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral, into account.

The Sub Committee were persuaded by the evidence of the interested parties (in particular that relating to problems from street drinking and risks of "pre-loading") that significant levels of crime, disorder and nuisance occur in the area of the proposed premises. The Sub Committee found that the proximity to the river, and establishments such as the night shelter (O'Hanlon House) and Lucy Faithful House make this a unique area and particularly sensitive to the problems of crime, disorder and nuisance that can be caused or aggravated by the retail sale of alcohol.

Members of the Sub Committee considered the Government Guidance and the policies of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, in particular LH8 (Hours for Off Sales of Alcohol) in relation to premises likely to become a focus for disturbance or public nuisance. They took into account the conditions agreed with the Police and that the Police had made no representation on the application. Nevertheless, the Sub Committee found that the application presented serious concerns for the prevention of crime, disorder and nuisance and that the Council had a responsibility under section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1988 to take all reasonable steps to prevent crime and disorder.

The Sub Committee considered the merits of the application and balanced the problems identified by the Interested Parties against the measures set out by the Applicant to prevent crime disorder and nuisance. Having taken all the arguments presented into account, the Sub Committee was not convinced that the measures proposed by the Applicant were sufficient to avoid aggravation of the problems with street drinking and access to alcohol.

Members believed that a premises retailing alcohol throughout the day and late into the night would add to existing crime, disorder and nuisance problems in the area and was unacceptable. The Sub Committee considered whether there were any additional conditions or restrictions on hours that could be imposed on the licence which would avoid the premises adding to the problems, but they found that neither further conditions nor reduced hours would address the problems. **The application was therefore REFUSED.**

3. Cowley Road Works, Cowley Road (Plain to Bullingdon Rd VARIATION)

10th June 2010

Application to Vary the Premises: For the event to occur on the Saturday and Sunday each year, from 10 am to 10 pm on both days: the licensable activities being live music, recorded music, dance, plays, entertainment similar to music and dancing, facilities to hold entertainments. Review conditions 1 & 5 of the Premises Licence (Noise related to amplifications and background music).

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee considered all submissions, both written and oral.

The Sub Committee found that the premises did fall within the Special Saturation Area for East Oxford (policy GN19). However, the variation sought was not a material variation so the policy was not engaged.

The Application was granted as applied for, subject to the following additional condition:-

(1) There shall be no licensable activity in Princes Street.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance.

4. The Lemon Tree, 268 Woodstock Road, Oxford, OX2 7NW

10th June 2010

Application for a New Premises: Films, recorded music, similar entertainment, provision of facilities for dancing and for similar entertainment 09.00 hrs to 01.30 hrs daily. Live music 18.00 hrs to 00.00 Monday to Thursday, until 01.00 hrs Friday and Saturday and until 23.30 on Sundays. Performance of dance 20.00 hrs to 01.30 hrs daily. Facilities for making music 09.00 hrs to 00.00 hrs daily. Late night refreshment from 23.00 hrs to 01.30 hrs daily. Supply of alcohol 11.00 hrs to 01.30 hrs daily.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee took into account all evidence submitted, both written and oral. It also considered the Statement of Licensing Policy for Oxford and government guidance made under s.182 of the Licensing Act.

The Sub Committee noted the concerns of the Interested parties. However, it also noted that the premises was one that had been operated by the Applicant in the recent past without any significant aggravation of the licensing objectives and the operation he now proposed was similar in nature.

The Sub Committee found that the conditions proposed by Environmental Protection in relation to noise control, together with those already agreed with Thames Valley Police in relation to control of crime and disorder were necessary to promote the licensing objectives and would be sufficient to address any future problems. The condition agreed with the Police on time of last entry should be amended slightly for reasons of clarity.

In order to prevent the use of the premises intensifying in conflict with the licensing objectives the Sub Committee found it necessary to attach two further conditions one restricting the primary use of the premises to a restaurant and the other restricting the operating hours on Sundays.

The Application was otherwise in accordance with the licensing objectives and was therefore GRANTED with the following additional conditions:-

(1) On Sunday all licensable activities shall cease at 23.00 hours, and the premises shall be closed to the public at 23.30 hours;

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance/prevention of crime and disorder.

(2) The primary purpose of the premises shall be a restaurant and all other licensable activities shall be ancillary to that purpose.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance / prevention of crime and disorder.

- (3) All doors and windows shall be kept closed, except for access and egress, during the performance of regulated entertainment.**

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance

- (4) Noise from regulated entertainment shall not exceed 45dB(A) at the boundary of any noise sensitive premises.**

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance.

The conditions previously agreed between the Applicant and Thames Valley Police were noted. In the interests of certainty and ease of understanding the Sub Committee found that Condition 2 of those conditions (last entry time) should be amended to read:

No new customer shall be admitted to the premises after 23.00 hours, except existing customers re-entering having been first admitted prior to 23.00.

The Sub Committee noted that the Applicant had given an undertaking to the hearing to surrender the licence should he dispose of his interest in the premises or otherwise cease to operate its licensable activities.

5. Grays Road Stores, 2 Grays Road, Oxford, OX3 7QA (REVIEW)

10th June 2010

Review of Premises Licence: Thames Valley Police had requested due to continual failure of test purchases made by underage buyers – failure to uphold the licensing objective: “Protection of Children from Harm”.

Decision and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee

The Sub Committee took all evidence into account, both written and oral. It considered the government guidance (as revised) especially paragraphs 11.19, 11.26 & 11.27 and the Statement of Licensing Policy for Oxford, particularly policies RE1 (reviews) and CH5 (prevention of underage consumption).

The Sub Committee found that the offences of underage sales were serious and by their nature risked impacting on the health, educational attainment and propensity for crime and disorder among young people. The fact that there had been three consecutive failed test purchases was of particular concern and demonstrated an apparent failure to address the problem, despite warnings from the police, fixed penalty notices and letters of advice. The offence of operating without a designated premises supervisor further aggravated the situation.

In such circumstances the Sub Committee considered that in order to promote the licensing objectives of protecting children from harm and preventing crime and disorder revocation of the licence must be contemplated.

The Sub Committee considered whether any of the other measures open to it might address the cause of the underage sales problem at the premises. However, it concluded that because of the record of the premises it could have no confidence that those measures would have any effect or that underage sales of alcohol at the premises would not re-occur..

Therefore the Sub Committee found that it was necessary and proportionate in the interests of preventing crime & disorder and to protect children from harm to revoke the licence.

The Sub Committee considered the licence holders right under the Human Rights Act 1998 (Art 1 -1st prtcl) not to be deprived of his licence, but found that revocation was clearly in the public interest and in accordance with the law .

6. R&H Newsagents, 89 St Clements Street, Oxford, OX4 1AR (REVIEW)

1st July 2010

Review of Premises Licence 08/00497/PREM: Thames Valley Police have requested due to continual failure of test purchases made by underage buyers – failure to uphold the licensing objectives: “Protection of Children from harm & Prevention of Crime & Disorder”.

Decision and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee

The Sub Committee took all evidence into account, both written and oral. It considered the government guidance (as revised) especially paragraphs 11.19, 11.26 & 11.27 and the Statement of Licensing Policy for Oxford, particularly policies RE1 (reviews) and CH5 (prevention of underage consumption).

The Sub Committee found that the offences of underage sales were serious and by their nature risked impacting on the health, educational attainment and propensity for crime and disorder among young people. The fact that there had been three instances of underage sales including two consecutive failed test purchases was of particular concern and demonstrated an apparent failure to address the problem, despite warnings from the police, fixed penalty notices and the provision of advice.

The Sub Committee found that the cause of the problem was a lack of training and understanding about the importance of preventing under age sales, especially on the part of junior staff. The premises licence currently had no conditions (save the mandatory ones) and the Sub Committee felt that the application of focused conditions would address the problems and was necessary to promote the licensing objectives.

Despite the serious nature of the underage sales the Sub Committee felt it was not yet necessary nor would it be proportionate to revoke the licence at this stage. The Premises Licence holder should be given the opportunity to operate the licence in compliance with the new conditions which would now be legally enforceable.

In such circumstances the Sub Committee considered that it was necessary to impose the following conditions upon the licence:

- 1) All sales of alcohol shall be made by persons who hold a personal licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Reason: *protecting children from harm and preventing crime and disorder.*

- 2) All members of staff at the premises shall seek credible photographic proof of age evidence from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years and who is seeking to purchase alcohol at the premises. Such credible evidence shall include a photograph of the holder and maybe a passport, photographic driving licence or any other proof of age document acceptable to Thames Valley Police.

Reason: *protecting children from harm and preventing crime and disorder.*

- 3) Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and in a suitable location at any points of sale, advising customers that they may be asked to produce evidence of their age.

Reason: *protecting children from harm and preventing crime and disorder*

- 4) A written log shall be kept of all instances of refused alcohol sales at the premises. Completed logs shall be retained for a minimum of 6 months and be made available to Thames Valley Police or the Licensing Authority on request.

Reason: *protecting children from harm and preventing crime and disorder*

7. 7 to 9 Shop, 146 Oxford Road, Cowley, Oxford, OX4 2EA

22nd July 2010

Application for a New Premises Licence: Off sales of alcohol from Monday to Friday 09.00 hrs to 23.00 hrs, Saturday 10.00 hrs to 23.00 hrs, Sunday 10.00 hrs to 21.00 hrs

Decision and Reasons of the Sub Committee

The Sub Committee took all representations into account, both written and oral. Having heard that conditions had now been agreed between the Applicant and Thames Valley Police and being satisfied that all those conditions were necessary to promote the licensing objectives, the application was therefore GRANTED subject to the following conditions being attached to the licence:

A Premises Daily Register shall be kept at the premises. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register shall record:-

The name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day;

All calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti social behaviour; the time and date of the call and the time and date of the incident

about which the call is made, and any actions taken to deal with the call;
Any refusals on the grounds of age or intoxication (to include the date, time, member of staff involved, reason for refusal as well as a brief physical description of the person refused);
Any calls or visits by Thames Valley Police in relation to any crime and disorder or like related matter;
The Premises Daily Register will be readily available for inspection by any responsible authority throughout the trading hours of the premises.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder/prevention of public nuisance

All members of staff at the premises shall seek “credible photographic proof of age evidence” from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years, and who is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence or Proof of Age card carrying a “PASS” logo.

Reason; Protection of children from harm/prevention of crime and disorder.

All staff shall be suitably trained for their job function for the premises. This shall include offences under the relevant licensing act, as well as the premises policies on how to uphold the four licensing objectives. The training shall be written into a programme, ongoing and under constant review, and must be available to a relevant responsible Authority when called upon.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder,/ protection of children from harm/prevention of public nuisance.

Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at all exit points to advise customers that the premises fall within an Alcohol Free Zone.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder.

8. Oxo's Stores, 104 Islip Road, Oxford, OX2 7SW

22nd July 2010

Application for a New Premises Licence: Off sales of alcohol on; Mon to Fri - 07.30 hours to 21.00 hours, Sat - 08.00 hours to 20.30 hours, Sun - 09.00 hours to 20.00 hours.

Decision and Reasons of the Sub Committee

The Sub Committee took all representations into account, both written and oral it considered the relevant government guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in particular policies LH8 (hours for off sales) and GN16 ('need' for licensed premises). The Sub Committee accepted the amendment for reduced hours for alcohol sales on Sunday.

The Sub Committee understood the concerns of the Interested Parties but was satisfied that the measures agreed with the relevant Responsible Authorities (***which it noted appeared on the applicant's operating schedule and would therefore be transferred as conditions onto Annex 2 of the Licence***) would address those concerns.

The Sub Committee found that it was important, in order to promote the licensing objectives that the sale of alcohol remain a subsidiary and not the primary purpose of the premises. To ensure this one further condition would be imposed on the licence.

The application was otherwise in accordance with the licensing objectives.

The amended application was therefore granted, with the following conditions:-

The primary purpose of the premises shall be as a convenience grocery store and the sale of alcohol shall be subsidiary to that purpose.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance/prevention of crime and disorder

For the avoidance of doubt, it was noted that the supply of alcohol shall be between the hours of 09.00 and 16.00 on Sunday.

9. Domino's Pizza, 18 Park End Street, Oxford, OX1 1HU (Variation)

22nd July 2010

Application for the Variation to Premises Licence: To extend the hours for sales of Late Night Refreshment from 23.00 hours to 05.00 hours the following day Sunday to Saturday, and for an additional hour upon the commencement of British Summer Time.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub Committee noted that the premises was at the edge of the Special Saturation Policy (SSP)(GN19) area, but as the application was for late night refreshment and did not involve the sale of alcohol, the SSP was not engaged.

The Sub-Committee took all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral, into account. It considered the relevant Government Guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy in particular policies PP10 (late night refreshment) and LH3 (licensing hours not limited).

The Sub Committee understood the concerns of the Interested Parties but noted that none of the Responsible Authorities had made representations against the application. It also noted that enforcement of parking regulations was a matter for the police or highway authority and not for the Licensing Authority.

Notwithstanding this the Sub Committee found that there was potential for increased noise nuisance from delivery drivers using Becket St during the extended hours applied for. The condition offered by the Applicant preventing the use of Becket St

for parking during the extended hours would go some way to addressing this problem and was necessary to prevent public nuisance.

The Sub Committee also found that the Operational Plan submitted by the Applicant contained reasonable measures which would help address any nuisance problems and it was therefore necessary and proportionate to make compliance with the Plan a condition of the Licence.

The Application was otherwise in accordance with the licensing objectives.

The Application was granted as applied for, with the following conditions:-

After midnight Sunday to Thursdays and 03.00hours Fridays and Saturdays, all delivery vehicles will park in the car park at the railway station to avoid any potential disturbance to residents or businesses in Becket Street.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance

Compliance with the Operational Plan submitted by the Applicant during the hearing shall be a condition of the Licence.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance

A copy of the Operating Plan shall be displayed at the Premises adjacent to the licence summary required under section 57(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance

Note

The Sub Committee recommended that the following matters be considered as voluntary measures by the Applicant in the interests of good neighbourliness, but found they were not sufficiently necessary or proportionate to form conditions on the licence:-

That there shall be no parking in Becket Street during all hours of opening;
That a copy of the Operational Plan and Driver's Code of Conduct shall be distributed to neighbours, with an explanation of how to lodge complaints concerning alleged breaches of the code;

That the Plan and Code, including a copy of the complaints procedure, should all be displayed within the premises.

10. Drinks R Us, 76 Cowley Road, Oxford, OX4 1JB

12th August 2010

Application for a New Premises Licence: Sale of alcohol (off sales only) 10am – 11pm Monday to Wednesday, 10am – Midnight Thursday - Sunday.

Decision and Reasons of the Sub Committee

The Sub Committee took all representations into account, both written and oral. The Sub Committee noted the conditions that had been agreed with the Police and was satisfied that these were sufficient to meet the four licensing objectives. The application was therefore GRANTED, with the following conditions:-

A Premises Daily Register shall be kept at the premises. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register shall record:-

The name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day;

All calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti social behaviour by persons attending or leaving the premises. This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of the call, and the time and date of the incident about which the call is made, and any actions taken to deal with the call;

Any refusals on the grounds of age or intoxication (to include the date, time, member of staff involved, reason for refusal as well as a brief physical description of the person refused);

Any calls or visits by Thames Valley Police in relation to any crime and disorder or like related matter;

The Premises Daily Register will be readily available for inspection by any responsible authority throughout the trading hours of the premises.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder/prevention of public nuisance

All members of staff at the premises shall seek “credible photographic proof of age evidence” from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years, and who is seeking to purchase alcohol from the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence or Proof of Age card carrying a “PASS” logo.

Reason: The protection of children from harm

All staff shall be suitably trained for their job function for the premises.

This shall include amongst other topics the law regarding the refusal of service to any person who is drunk or underage, and staff shall be made aware of how to seek identification from anyone who appears to be underage. All staff shall sign and date a document to confirm that. The training shall be written into a programme, ongoing and under constant review, and must be available to a relevant Responsible Authority when called upon.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder, / protection of children from harm/ prevention of public nuisance.

Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at all exit points to advise customers that the premises fall within an Alcohol Free Zone.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder.

A CCTV system shall be installed or the existing system maintained. The system will incorporate as a minimum standard a camera covering any of the entrance /exit doors, and be capable of providing an image that is regarded as "identification standard".

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder.

Prominent clear notices shall be displayed at the premises about the supply of alcohol to minors and the relevant offences involved.

Reason: the protection of children from harm.

(7) The sale of alcohol shall be ancillary to the business to be carried on at the premises as described in the operating schedule to the premises application, namely as a general store.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance/prevention of crime and disorder

The Licence Holder shall implement a written dispersal; policy to (if required) move customers from the premises and the immediate vicinity in such a way as to cause minimal disturbance or nuisance to neighbours, both residential and business, and to make the minimum impact upon the neighbourhood in relation to potential nuisance, antisocial behaviour, crime and disorder. The policy shall be approved in writing by the Licensing Authority.

Reason: The prevention of public nuisance/prevention of crime and disorder

**11. Park Road Stores, 16 Florence Park Road, Greys Road, Oxford. OX4 3PH
(Review)**

12th August 2010

Review of Premises Licence: Premises has failed 3 successive test purchase operations and as such has not been upholding its obligations under the protection of children from harm or the prevention of crime and disorder objectives

Decision and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee

The Sub Committee took all evidence into account, both written and oral.

The Sub Committee found that the offences of underage sales were serious and by their nature risked impacting on the health, educational attainment and propensity for crime and disorder among young people. The fact that there had been three consecutive failed test purchases was of particular concern.

However, the Sub Committee considered whether any of the measures open to it might address the cause of the underage sales problem at the premises. It gave particular weight to the conditions suggested by Thames Valley Police and it was noted that the Licence Holder had agreed to accept and implement all the conditions. The Sub Committee was satisfied that these would address the concerns expressed by the Police and would therefore address the 4 licensing objectives.

The conditions outlined below would be attached to the existing licence. Therefore the Sub Committee found that there was no need to revoke the licence.

- (1) All members of staff at the premises shall seek “credible photographic proof of age evidence” from any person who appears to be under the age of 25 years, and who is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence, which shall include a photograph of the customer, will either be a passport, photographic driving licence or Proof of Age card carrying a “PASS” logo.**

Reason: The protection of children from harm

- (2) All staff shall be suitably trained for their job function for the premises. This shall include offences under the relevant licensing act as well as the premises policies on how to uphold the four licensing objectives. The training shall be written into a programme, ongoing and under constant review, and must be available to a relevant Responsible Authority when called upon.**

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder, / protection of children from harm/ prevention of public nuisance/ promotion of public safety

All staff shall sign and date an audit sheet each time they receive the training outlined in condition 2 (above) to confirm that this has taken place, and that they have fully understood the content. This record shall be made readily available to the licensing authority or Thames Valley police upon request.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder, / protection of children from harm/ prevention of public nuisance/ promotion of public safety

A Premises Daily Register shall be kept at the premises. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register should record:-

The name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day:

All calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti social behaviour by persons attending or leaving the premises. This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of the call and the time and date of the incident about which the call is made, and any actions taken to deal with the call;

**Any refusals on grounds of age and/or intoxication (to include date, time , member of staff involved, reasons for refusal as well as a brief physical description of the person refused);
Any calls to or visits by Thames Valley police in relation to any crime and disorder or like related matter**

The Premises Daily Register will be readily available for inspection by any responsible authority throughout the trading hours of the premises.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder, / protection of children from harm/ prevention of public nuisance

The Designated Premises Supervisor shall gain the BIIAB level 2 qualification for personal licence holders.

Reason: Prevention of crime and disorder, / protection of children from harm/ prevention of public nuisance/ promotion of public safety.

It was further agreed that within four weeks of the premises receiving the hearing notice, all persons involved at that time in the operation of the premises shall attend a meeting with Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority at Oxford City Council for a grounding in the licensing act and their responsibilities contained therein. Failure to attend this meeting within the 4 week period will result in an automatic suspension of the premises licence for a period of one calendar month whilst adequate training and due diligence is put in place to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

The Licence Holder's attention was drawn to this stipulation and it was stressed that he must make contact with these 2 authorities within 1 month of receiving his copy of the decision notice.
