DECLARING INTERESTS

What is a personal interest?

You have a personal interest in a matter if that matter affects the well-being or financial position of you, your relatives or people with whom you have a close personal association more than it would affect the majority of other people in the ward(s) to which the matter relates.

A personal interest can affect you, your relatives or people with whom you have a close personal association positively or negatively. If you or they would stand to lose by the decision, you should also declare it.

You also have a personal interest in a matter if it relates to any interests, which you must register.

What do I need to do if I have a personal interest?

You must declare it when you get to the item on the agenda headed "Declarations of Interest" or as soon as it becomes apparent to you. You may still speak and vote unless it is a prejudicial interest.

If a matter affects a body to which you have been appointed by the authority, or a body exercising functions of a public nature, you only need declare the interest if you are going to speak on the matter.

What is a prejudicial interest?

You have a prejudicial interest in a matter if;

- a member of the public, who knows the relevant facts, would reasonably think your personal interest is so significant that it is likely to prejudice your judgment of the public interest; and
- b) the matter affects your financial interests or relates to a licensing or regulatory matter; and
- c) the interest does not fall within one of the exempt categories at paragraph 10(2)(c) of the Code of Conduct.

What do I need to do if I have a prejudicial interest?

If you have a prejudicial interest you must withdraw from the meeting. However, under paragraph 12(2) of the Code of Conduct, if members of the public are allowed to make representations, give evidence or answer questions about that matter, you may also make representations as if you were a member of the public. However, you must withdraw from the meeting once you have made your representations and before any debate starts.

Introduction

- 1. This report informs Committee of progress made by the Licensing Authority ("the Authority) under the duties of the Licensing Act 2003 and Gambling Act 2005 between January 2011 and March 2011. Under Policy GN10 of the Statement of Licensing Policy, the Licensing Authority should report to the Committee on matters determined by the Head of Environmental Development with delegated authority.
- 2. The report covers data on service volumes; details of Licensing hearing decisions; decisions made under delegated powers; information on Temporary Event Notices ("TENs") and enforcement activity.
- 3. There are no financial requirements for consideration contained within this report.

Applications Received by the Licensing Authority

4. The table below provides data on licence applications received and processed during the period January 2011 to March 2011, and the totals for this period; and the totals for the year end.

5. To date the Licensing Authority has processed; 1,250 Personal Licences; 850 New Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates; 252 Variations on Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates; 594 Premises Transfer Applications.

Applications Granted by the Licensing Authority

6. A hearing is not required where an application has been lawfully made and no Responsible Authority or Interested Party has made a representation. 13 licences in this category were issued by the Head of Environmental Development under delegated authority, details of which are listed in **Appendix 1**.

Temporary Event Notices

- 7. A Temporary Event Notice (TEN) is a notification given by an individual to Oxford City Council giving notice of an event that is to take place. Only the Police can object to a TEN. If, as in most cases, there is no objection and the application does not exceed the maximum number of events in a year, the TEN is simply acknowledged and returned to the applicant. Should the Police object then the TEN will go to a hearing.
- 8. Temporary Event Notices relate to temporary events with less than 500 attendees where 'licensable activities' are planned to take place. Attached at **Appendix 2** is a list of the 144 TENs applied for between January 2011 and March 2011.

Representations and Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings

- When Relevant Representations are received from Interested Parties or Responsible Authorities then the application is determined at a Licensing Sub-Committee Hearing.
- 10. A total of 7 Relevant Representations were received for 2 Premises Licence applications, and 1 Review application processed during January 2011 March 2011. This resulted in all of the applications being determined by hearings (details of which are attached as **Appendix 3**), and 2 other applications being withdrawn by the applicants.

Reviews of Licensed Premises

- 12. Under the 2003 Act it is possible for the Authority to review a Premises Licence at any time if a representation is received from a Responsible Authority or an Interested Party. The Authority has no powers to initiate its own review. Reviews may only arise in connection with a failure or failures in the premises connected to the licensing objectives.
- 13. Between January 2011 and March 2011 there was 1 application for a Premises Licence Review as listed above. This was applied for by Thames Valley Police, and is detailed further in **Appendix 3**.
- 14. Representations were received from 3 Interested Parties supporting the Police in their Review application.

Appeals under the Licensing Act 2003

- 15. The Licensing Authority received notification from the Magistrates' Court of 2 appeals lodged by applicants.
- 16. The first was lodged by the premises licence holder of Grays Road Stores. The matter was refered back to the Licensing Sub-Committee Hearing on 27th January 2011 for consideration. The applicant has amended the working practices of the business to uphold the licensing objectives, and the Sub-Committee were satisfied that the licence need not be revoked, and the Magistrates made a Consent Order that the conditions agreed between Thames Valley Police and the Premises Licence holder at this Hearing, be placed on the Premises Licence.

17. The second was lodged by the premises licence holder for The Bridge. At the time of writing this report, as date has not yet been set to hear the appeal.

Enforcement Activity

- 18. Between January 2011 and March 2011, the Licensing Team has instigated:
 - 59 Compliance Check inspections of licensed premises.
 - On 6 occasions during the period January 2011 March 2011, the Licensing Team carried out night time enforcement of late night venues. A total of 47 premises were visited. Some minor issues were found during these late night visits that resulted in further action being taken on the night to rectify matters found.
 - Further to the compliance checks, and the late night enforcement inspections, the following actions were taken:
 - 4 Advisory letters issued
 - 3 Verbal Warnings were issued
 - 0 Written Warning were issued
 - 0 Final Warning were issued
 - 2 PACE interviews were conducted
- 19. Between January 2011 March 2011, no test purchase operations took place, due to internal financial restructuring within Thames Valley Police Licensing Units. Funding has been provided to Thames Valley Police for Test Purchase Operations to commence shortly.

Nightsafe

- 21. The NightSafe initiative contributes to the licensing objectives. This includes intelligence sharing with the Police, Fire Authority and Trading Standards. However due to internal financial restructuring, the NightSafe inspections have now ceased.
- 22. The Licensing Team has invited the NightSafe Manager to attend Enforcement visits in order to benefit from her knowledge and to provide for close agency partnership working.

Future Work

23. Following the restructuring of the Thames Valley Police Licensing Units, and the financial restructuring to the NightSafe Partnership, the Licensing Team has explored alternative ways in which to maintain Partnership working. Test Purchase Operations are due to commence from 1st June 2011 with Thames Valley Police following funding provided by Oxford City Community Safety Team.

24. The monthly NightSafe meetings have been reconstructed to meet the needs of the varying agencies in attendance, however, the Licensing Team is keen to initiate a meeting of just Responsible Authorities, in order to ensure clarity in the use of the Licensing Act 2003, and avoid confusions between irresponsible individual social behaviours and the responsibilities of the licensed premises.

25. Discussions have commenced with the City Centre Manager, and the licensees of the City Centre, in an attempt to provide joint initiatives that will make Oxford more appealing to those who visit during the day, and work towards the evening and night time economy all being interlinked. The idea of making coming to Oxford an "event" to the visitor is one of the initiatives being considered.

26. Members are to receive "bespoke" training in licensing matters from Ely Place Chambers. This follows on from the Licensing Team's tie in with the Institute of Licensing. It should be noted that such training is in keeping with the City Council's vision of being an efficient and modern service provider, and shows initiative in investing in it's Members.

27. The relationship between the Licensing Team and the Institute of Licensing has grown significantly in recent months. Oxford hosted it's first I.O.L. course on 11th May 2011, and various others are planned for later in the year. Such developments raise the profile of the Authority, and provide links to other Licensing practitioners in the country.

28. The Licensing Team is continuing to explore avenues to obtain the necessary accreditation to teach the National Award for Personal Licence Holders, however this has been put on hold during the Council's restructure.

29. At present the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Bill is making it's way through Parliament. This will have some effects on the Licensing Act 2003, and as a way to introduce Members to the relevant contents of the Government's proposed "Rebalancing of the Licensing Act", a brief description of the proposed changes are attached as **Appendix 4**. A report giving further details of these changes will be submitted upon the Bill receiving ascent.

The application was withdrawn before being put before the Sub-Committee.

27th January 2011: Chair: N/A

Variation of Premises Licence: Application to extend the sale of alcohol and provision of regulated entertainment on Tuesdays and Thursdays from the current hours of 10.00 to 01.00 hours to 10.00 to 02.00 hours the following morning. To extend the provision of late night refreshment on Tuesdays and Thursdays from the current hours of 23.00 to 01.00 hours the following morning to 23.00 to 02.00 hours the following morning.

The application was withdrawn before being put before the Sub-Committee.

3. Kukui, 42-43 Park End Street, Oxford, OX1 1JD (Variation)

17th February 2011 Chair: Cllr Brundin

Variation of Premises Licence: Application to extend licensable hours for the provision of regulated entertainment, provision of entertainment facilities, provision of late night refreshment and for sale of alcohol (on and off supplies) from 02.00 hrs to 03.00 hrs on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub-Committee took all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral, into account.

It also considered both the Government Guidance under section 182 of the Act and the City Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy (SLP) in particular paras 10.19 & 10.20 of the Guidance (Hours of Trading) and Policies LH1 (Zoning), LH5 (Closing Times) and G19 of the SLP (Special Saturation Policy (SSP)) of the SLP.

It was not in dispute that the Premises fell within the City Centre SSP area. The Sub Committee found that the application sought was a 'material variation' because if granted it would mean an increase in the operating hours and the evidence from Thames Valley Police indicated that such an increase would aggravate problems of cumulative impact.

There was therefore a presumption against granting the application unless the Applicant could satisfy the Sub Committee that they had measures in place to prevent any increase in crime and disorder.

The Sub Committee was not satisfied that the Applicant had demonstrated this. The Sub Committee reached this conclusion for the following reasons:

- 1. The fact that a number of temporary events (TENS) had been held until 3am, apparently without incident, was not sufficient, given the overall record of crime and disorder at the Premises, to demonstrate that a permanent variation would not lead to more incidents.
- 2. Whether, as the Applicants argued, an extension until 3am would reduce on street crime and disorder by preventing 'club hopping', was unknown and not made out by the evidence.
- **3.** The variation, if granted, would lead to a additional hours drinking time for up to 700 persons and the resulting increase in intoxication was in itself likely to aggravate problems of crime and disorder.
- 4. The Police evidence was clear that the variation would lead to increased problems at local flashpoints at the especially sensitive time of 3am. Whilst the Police case in this respect was to some extent speculative, such speculation was unavoidable and the Sub Committee were more persuaded by the Police speculation than that of the Applicant.
- **5.** Any comparison with the operating hours of similar premises in the vicinity was not a relevant consideration as each application had to be considered on its own merits
- 6. The Sub Committee took into account the economic pressure on licence holders including the Applicant but found that those pressures were overridden by the requirement to promote the licensing objectives.
- 7. The Sub Committee considered whether any new conditions could be added to the licence to allow the variation to be granted without compromising the licensing objectives but decided that the licence was already heavily conditioned and no new conditions were likely to have an effect.

The presumption in the SSP against granting the application was therefore not rebutted and in order to promote the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder the Sub Committee **REFUSED** the Application.

4. The Bridge, 6-9 Hythe Bridge Street, Oxford, OX1 2EW

22nd February 2011 Chair: Cllr Coulter

Review of Premises Licence: Application made by Thames Valley Police based on the grounds the operator is not upholding his obligations under the four objectives of the Licensing Act most notably the prevention of crime and disorder. Thames Valley Police now believe that the most appropriate recourse moving forward is to refer the premises on again to the Licensing committee

Decision and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee

The Sub-Committee took all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral, into account.

It also considered both the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and Government Guidance under section 182 of the Act in particular section 11 on Reviews and paras 11.9, 11.19 & 11.22.

The Sub-Committee found that the police concerns were valid and the evidence illustrated a high level of crime and disorder at the premises including serious incidents on 25/10/10 and 31/10/10. The level of crime and disorder needed to be addressed. The Sub-Committee gave careful consideration as to how best to promote the licensing objectives in particular the prevention of crime and disorder and were satisfied that modification of the hours of operation is necessary.

The licensable hours of the premises shall be modified by reducing the terminal hour for all licensable activities by one hour in order to reduce crime and disorder. The modification of hours shall be temporary and last for a period of three months from the date this decision comes into effect.

The Sub-Committee took into account the financial impact the modification may have on the premises and the right of the premises licence holder not to be deprived of his licence. However they found that the temporary modification was a proportionate response and in the public interest. The three month period would allow the premises to address the levels of crime and disorder after which the hours would return to those currently operated. However, if after the period of modification the problems had not been addressed the Police would be able to seek a further review. The modification of hours would also go some way to addressing the problems of public nuisance affecting the interested parties.

The Sub-Committee found that there appeared to be little co-operation between the management and staff of premises, and the Police and that this may be contributing to the cause of the problems highlighted in the review application. Co-operation between the Police and the Premises should be of particular importance to resolving the problems. The Sub-Committee encouraged the Premises, with the co-operation of the Police, to address problems and in particular the following particular issues:

- 1. The provision of at least one female doors staff
- 2. The inadequate partition of the smoking area between the premises and the neighbouring premises which appeared to allow migration between the two.
- 3. Measures to help prevent any sales of alcohol to intoxicated people

5. <u>Branos Express, Kiosk 4, 108 Gloucester Green, Oxford, OX1 2BU (Variation)</u>

17th March 2011 Chair: Cllr Coulter

Variation of Premises Licence: To extend the hours for Late Night Refreshment from 03.00 hours to 04.00 hours Friday and Saturday night.

Decisions and reasons of the Licensing Sub-Committee:

The Sub-Committee took all submissions and evidence presented, both written and oral, into account. The Sub Committee also considered government guidance and relevant parts of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, in particular policies PP10 (Late Night Refreshment) and LH3 (Licensing Hours not Limited).

The Sub Committee found that, taking into account the Police representation, any concerns about crime and disorder could be resolved by the Premises joining the Radiolink scheme and installing suitable CCTV.

The Sub Committee considered the risks of public nuisance expressed by Cllr Brett on behalf of residents. However, they found that a certain amount of noise, even late at night, was to be expected in a city centre location. The imposition of conditions requiring sufficient staff to prevent queues developing and notices asking customers to respect local residents would help to reduce the risk of nuisance problems to an acceptable level. Conditions to prevent litter nuisance should also be attached.

The Sub Committee **GRANTED** the Application but found it necessary and proportionate to attach the following conditions on the Licence:

- 1. A CCTV system shall be installed, or the existing system maintained. It shall be "fit for purpose". It shall comply with the current and relevant Thames Valley police guidelines for Standard Minimum Closed Circuit Television Requirements (Issue 1, July 2004)
- **a.** The system will incorporate a camera covering the serving area, and be capable of providing an image which is regarded as "identification standard".
- b. The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and any recordings shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 1 calendar month. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained. The system will comply with other essential legislation and all signs required will be clearly displayed. The system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.
- c. A member of staff that is able to operate the system and provide copies of any footage requested by an employee of Thames Valley Police upon request, will be on duty at all times the premises is open.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder

2. The premises shall be a member of the 'Radiolink Scheme'.

Reason: The prevention of crime and disorder

In terms of how the Licensing Act 2003 will be amended and therefore the knock on effect to ourselves, the following parts of the Act will become subject to change:

Licensing

New powers for councils

Under the Bill's proposals:

- Licensing Authorities will become 'Responsible Authorities', gaining the
 power intervene in licensing applications and to take action against existing
 premises licences where there are problems.
- The 'light touch' regime for 'temporary events' will be modified to allow council's environmental health departments to intervene if events would disrupt or endanger the local community.
- The loophole which previously allowed premises to avoid existing controls by using temporary event notices will be closed – licensing authorities will be able to insist that existing licensing controls remain in place, and that the local community is properly protected.
- Councils will also be given more flexible powers to allow temporary events to go ahead, rather than having to adhere to the current rigid rules which have led to the cancellation of events, despite their potential benefit to the local community.
- The maximum period a temporary event can last will be extended to seven days.
- Licensing authorities will gain a crucial new power to suspend licences where annual fees are not paid. This will help councils to recover money owing and to tackle the minority of rogue businesses who do not comply.

Licensing Fees

Under the Bill's proposals:

The Government proposes that Licensing authorities set their own fees.

Late night levy

Under the Bill's proposals:

• Councils will be able to require late night operators who supply alcohol between midnight and 6am to pay a levy in addition to their existing licence fees. The levy would be payable to licensing authorities, who would then deduct their administrative costs and could then use up to 30% of the levy income in providing extra measures to reduce or prevent crime and disorder. The remaining 70% of levy income must be paid to the police.

Proposals are for charges to be set on a national level and be based on rateable value bands and apply to both on and off-trade. The fees will be split evenly between the police and local authority. The five rateable bands are as follows:

A. No rateable value to £4.300: £299

B. £4,301 to £33,000: £768 C. £33,001 to £87,000: £1,259 D. £87,001 to £125,000: £1,365 E. £125,001 and above: £1,493

Premises in Bands D and E who "primarily or exclusively sell alcohol" will be subject to a multiplier of two and three respectively taking the charges to £2,730 and £4,400.

The Government confirmed that discounts and exemptions will be available to premises that take action "to ensure that they do not have a negative impact on their local community through membership of schemes such as Best Bar None and Pubwatch."

It also suggested authorities may exempt hotels as they only serve their own customers and are unlikely to contribute to policing costs.

Other changes to the licensing system

Under the Bill's proposals:

- The burden on councils to produce, consult on and publish a licensing policy statement every three years will be replaced with a system by which councils can update policies whenever necessary.
- The extension of "Early Morning Restriction Orders to be applicable between 24:00 and 06:00 (previously 03:00 to 06:00)
- Fines for underage sales will be doubled from (from £10,000 to £20,000).
