Environmental Health and Community Safety, and those provided	
by partner organisations such as the Thames Valley Police,	
Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service and Trading Standards,	
should be asked to report to the code administrator if they have	
reason to believe that, having been signed up to the voluntary	
code of good practice, the management of a guest house is non-	
compliant with it. The single point of contact should then be asked	
to demonstrate that they have addressed the concerns raised or	
risk being suspended from the code.

c) Introduce a public awareness campaign that empowers people	
to come forward with safeguarding concerns.
