Introduction and background

 This report is made to the Licensing & Gambling Acts Casework Sub- Committee so it may determine in accordance with its powers and the Licensing Act 2003 whether to grant a variation to a Premises Licence to Midcounties Co-operative Limited.

Application Summary

2. An application to vary a Premises Licence has been submitted by Midcounties Cooperative Limited. A summary of the licensable activities applied for and the time proposed for these activities can be found detailed below:

Other Relevant Considerations

12. The Sub-Committee is reminded of its responsibilities under the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (to co-operate in the reduction of crime and disorder in Oxford) and the Human Rights Act (which guarantees the right to a fair hearing for all parties in the determination of their civil rights, and also provides for the protection of property, which may include licences in existence, and the protection of private and family life) when considering the fair balance between the interests of the applicant and the rights of local residents. Any decision taken by the Sub-Committee must be necessary and proportionate to the objectives being pursued.

- 13. Members are reminded that whenever they make a decision under the Licensing Act 2003, they have a duty to act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.
- 14. When considering any representations, only those issues relating to the four licensing objectives should be considered and appropriate weight given to the importance and relevance of each representation.
- 15. In making its decision, Members must also have regard to the Home Office statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 16. The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:

a) Grant the licence in accordance with the application.

b) Modify the conditions of the operating schedule by altering or omitting or adding to them.

c) Exclude or restrict from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.


d) Reject the whole of the application.

The Sub-Committee may also grant the licence subject to different conditions for different parts of the premises or the different licensable activities.

- 17. Members are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject whole or part of the application merely because they consider it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate to do so in order to promote the licensing objectives. Any such step must relate to a relevant representation made.
- 18. If Members grant the application, the details of the operating schedule will be incorporated into the licence as conditions. The licence will also be subject to certain mandatory conditions.
- 19. Members should note that the applicant or persons making representations have the right of appeal against the decision made by the Sub-Committee.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence:
 - a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 - b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his / her Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. 1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - 2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:
 - a) a holographic mark; or
 - b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. 1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:
 - a) duty is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - b) permitted price is the price found by applying the formula: P=D+(DxV) where:
 - i) P is the permitted price,
 - ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - c) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:
 - i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - e) valued added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
 - 3). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
 - 4). 1) Sub-paragraph 2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 5. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means:
 - a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day
 - b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day
 - c. On Christmas Day
 - d. On Good Friday

0800 hours to 2300 hours 1000 hours. to 2230 hours 1200 noon to 1500 hours and 1900 hours to 2230 hours 0800 hours to 2230 hours

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

(a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;

(b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.
- 6. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.

I am writing to object to the application for an extension of the hours for selling alcohol on three grounds.

The first ground is the prevention of crime and disorder. There are very often people begging outside this Co-op in the evenings. In some cases this is associated with drug-dealing, which is extremely prevalent in Jericho. People who are addicted to drugs often have a problem with alcohol as well and late-night sales over a longer period are likely to attract problem users of both drugs and alcohol, thus increasing crime and disorder.

The second ground is the promotion of public safety. I have had many reports of rowdy behaviour outside the Co-op and in the vicinity, by people who were clearly drunk, and I have quite often witnessed this for myself. The people involved are often only about 18 or slightly older. I would not want to see them have more time to buy the alcohol that is presumably injuring the health of at least some of them. They are also at risk on the roads.

The third ground is the prevention of public nuisance. I often get complaints about the rowdy people referred to above from residents who are trying to sleep. One more hour for buying alcohol would extend the time that such noise is creating a public nuisance for the long-suffering residents of Jericho.

If the Panel decides that it does wish to grant this application, please put some conditions on the permission. Some are obvious, such as a guarantee of proper enforcement of the various safeguards that we have concerning the sale of alcohol. One more unusual one that I'd like to suggest is that the Co-op Store should be asked to undertake from now on to contact the police on 101 every time they see someone begging outside the shop. Begging is against the law and we must try to get the police to enforce it better, especially in residential areas such as Jericho. (I have of course raised this on several occasions with the police.) Even if this condition cannot legally be imposed, please request informally that the Co-op should do their best to address this long - standing problem. I know they are keen to be good neighbours.
