# SEVERE WEATHER EMERGENCY PROTOCOL (SWEP) PROVISION

Oxford City Council maintains additional capacity to provide beds in extreme weather, operated from existing homeless hostels and other locations according to demand.

The other Oxfordshire District Councils provide no additional SWEP capacity in their locality but each contributes some funding for one bed each in Oxford's SWEP should they need to divert people from their localities.

Oxford Winter Night Shelter (OWNS) 10 spaces across 7 churches – revolving (Jan to Mar 18)

Accommodation with Response (150+ beds) and MIND (85 beds - transitional)

Young Persons Pathway (227 bed in Oxon)

Mental Health Partnership Accommodation

Emergency Beds (2); Young Persons (57); Young Parents (17); & Speicalist (15) beds – Home Group & Key 2; & LIFE Housing (Young Mothers)
