## SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A key issue for the first three months of the new Administration was to undertake a review of the capital programme. In order to make clear to officers what the revised capital programme is going to be, the Executive Board needs to make decisions as soon as possible.

#### Recommendations

The Executive Board is asked to:-

- Review the projects identified within the appendices and to request Officers to provide detailed progress reports on such schemes as they choose;
- 2. Note the current level of uncommitted capital resources immediately available for new investment and the estimate of resources expected to be available during the year;
- 3. Approve that a further report be brought back to the Executive in the Autumn on resources becoming available for 2002/03 and 2003/04;
- 4. Approve the new list of schemes, Appendix B, waiting for release once resources are available;
- 5. Approve that the 'Capital Bids' process be assimilated in to Business Planning thus moving investment decisions in line with the annual revenue budgeting cycle;

6. Ask Business Managers to develop detailed project timetables that are then matched against a resources timetable in order manage the overall Capital Programme more effectively.

#### 1. Background

1.1 The Executive Board, at its meeting of the 27<sup>th</sup> May, asked for a review to be carried out on schemes within the current capital programme where resources did not seem to be actively committed. This report provides further information on possible areas for more detailed reviews.

#### 2. Current Situation

- 2.1 There are three main elements of review within the current capital programme:
  - previous year items on which there has been no progress but which are funded
  - current year items on which there has been no progress but which are funded
  - current year items which are NOT funded

In addition to this the Executive Board will need to add any new commitments e.g. those identified within the Labour Group's manifesto (such as the investment in leisure centres).

- 2.2 In order to try and identify schemes where no progress has been made, Finance Officers interrogated the Council's finance system (Agresso) for schemes where there has been no spending. Additionally, the Capital Programme itself was examined to see what schemes appeared to show significant slippage (time delays) which might indicate the possibility these being further delayed in order to re-prioritise resources, or cancelled in order to release those resources. In addition to these, the list of new / recently approved and fully funded schemes (reported to 23<sup>rd</sup> April Executive as Tranche A) have also been included as, Appendix A. For all these schemes shown, a preliminary review has already been carried out by the Leader who, in some cases, has asked for a detailed report to be brought back to the Executive in order that ongoing funding decisions can be properly made.
- 2.3 The Capital Resources report to the 23<sup>rd</sup> April also identified a number of schemes that were held awaiting resources to become available, these were referred to as Tranche B. This list of schemes has now been updated, by the current administration, and a new 'waiting list' is attached at Appendix B for approval.

2.4 In arriving at these schemes shown within Appendix A, Finance Officers were not able to take into account any contractual commitment or invoices not yet processed in to Agresso. If the Executive decides it might wish to alter the funding available on these schemes then it needs to commission detailed reports from the appropriate Business Unit Manager on current progress including any contractual commitments

### 3 Available Resources

When last reported to the Executive Board on the 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2002, the estimated new capital resources expected to be received and available for spending in the current financial year amounted to £3,628,000. The current position, as advised by Head of Property, is as follows:-

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The Executive Board is reminded that it can only spend resources of this nature once they have been physically received in our bank. In that regard, of the £4,084,000 approximately £462,000 has already been received to date as is immediately available for spending.

The Executive Board is asked to instruct Officers to develop a detailed timetable per project, including 'spending / cash flow' start dates, and also the receipt of resources so that the Council can benefit from better cash flow management and more effective project management. The information will also identify overall cash flow pinch points and has been illustrated at Appendix C.

## 4 Future Capital Bids

- As the Executive Board will be aware, much work has gone in to developing a Business Planning process that drives the annual Revenue Budget process. It was also intended that Business Planning would set in place the requirements for Capital Investment. Year 2 of the Business Planning will shortly get underway and the Executive Board is now asked to approve the assimilation of the 'Capital Bids' process in to the Business Planning environment. The main advantages of this would be that Capital Investments would be closer aligned to financial years, which should improve spend performance, and would mean that the Executive Board would be taking capital investments decisions at the same time as Business Unit expansion / reduction decisions. This should focus resources in to achieving aspects of the Council's vision in a more coherent and timely way.
- The Property Manager has been asked to bring to a future Executive Board, options for generating capital resources of approx. £5m for the year 2003/04. At this stage the Leader has indicated that the areas of priority spend are:- Renovation Grants and areas highlighted as part of the Community Buildings Best Value review. The Executive Board is asked to confirm these priorities and request that Business Mangers consider these when developing their Business Plans for 2003/04.
