#### 210. OPEN SESSION

Mr. R. Johnson addressed the Committee on behalf of the Oxford branch of the British Sub-Aqua Club concerning outstanding work to accommodation at Hinksey Park used by the organisation. He also said that a room the club had in the past used as a lecture room was currently being used by Leisure as a store, which seriously affected the club's operations. As a result, Mr Johnson told the Committee, the club had not signed the lease for the accommodation.

Councillor Bob Price read out a note from a resident of White House Road concerning anti-social behaviour in the area. He said that he would, as one of the Ward members for the area, take up the matters raised with officers.

Resolved, in relation to the address by Mr Johnson, to express concern at the effects the situation was having on the operation of the group and to ask the Executive Board to review the position concerning the lease with a view to including the area formerly used by the group as a lecture room.

# 214. MANAGEMENT OF TRADE REFUSE AND RELATED ISSUES IN FRIARS ENTRY AND ELSEWHERE IN THE CITY CENTRE

The Area Co-ordinator submitted a note (previously circulated and now appended).

The Committee was addressed by Mrs. W. Skinner-Smith, a resident of Friars Entry, and by Mr. W. McCardle concerning the work of the Friars Entry Business Group.

# Resolved:-

- (2) to express disappointment at the fact that only part of Friars Entry had so far been deep-cleaned and to ask that the work be completed as soon as possible;
- (3) to express the hope that the two Environmental Enforcement Officers whose appointment had recently been agreed would

- work closely with the Area Co-ordinator and the Friars Entry Business Group;
- (4) to RECOMMEND the Executive Board to include streetscene matters in the review of the Public Realm Strategy, which was one of the recommendations of the Cornmarket Review, and also that the review of the strategy be commenced soon and completed as soon as possible.
