270. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

An apology for absence was received from Councillor Malik.

271. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest.

272. COUNCIL TAX 2007/08

The Strategic Director, Finance and Corporate Services submitted a report (previously circulated and now appended).

Resolved:

- (1) to RECOMMEND Council to agree: -
 - (a) the City Council's precept and requirement from Council Tax was £11,107,675;
 - (b) the Basic Amount of Council Tax at Band D of £240.53. This represented an increase of 3% on the 2006/07 figure of £233.52. This increase equated to £7.01 per annum (13 pence per week);
 - (c) that the amount of £527,573 be treated as the Special Expenses of the Unparished Area;
 - (d) Band D Council Taxes for the various areas of the City (excluding the Police and County Council's additions) as follows: -

Littlemore	£248.83
Old Marston	£263.66
Risinghurst and Sandhills	£250.49
Blackbird Leys	£233.66
Unparished Area	£239.54

and to note that these figures included the Parish precepts (or Unparished Area addition) on top of the City-wide Council Tax of $\pounds 225.49$;

- Appendices 1 and 2 of the report that related to the statutory calculations for setting the Council Tax and the calculation of the Council Tax by Council Tax Band;
- (2) to note: -
 - (a) the County Council's precept of £48,447,438 and its Council Tax at Band D of £1,049.10, and that this had increased by 4.0% compared to 2006/07;
 - (b) the Thames Valley Police Authority's precept of £6,427,932 and a Council Tax at Band D of £139.19 (a 5.0% increase on 2006/07);
 - (c) that the overall average Band D Council Tax was £1,428.82.
