## Introduction

1. Under s179 of the lising Act 1996, the Council has a legal duty to "secure that advice and information about homelessness and the prevention of homelessness is available free of charge to any person in their district".

- 2. This duty is discharged by the Housing Options team in the performance of its daily duties but there is a need to supplement this to provide an independent advice service to all the citizens of the City.
- 3. Executive Board agreed on 17 March that this service would be fulfilled through an open competitive tendering process with an estimated value of £80,000 per year. The contract will run for a 2-year period with the option of an extension for 1 year. The emphasis of the re-tendered service will be on the prevention of homelessness.

## **Tendering**

- 4. The tendering process, in accordance with EU regulations, is well underway. The intention is to commence the contract from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2008, which means the process is under a tight schedule and deadline. The tendering schedule is appended.
- 5. In order to meet this schedule and commencement date it will be necessary for officers to be given delegated authority to agree and accept the tender.
- 6. The tender will be accepted on the basis that it is most economically advantageous to the Council.
- 7. The experience of the previous tendering exercise in 2004 shows that tenderers will want to negotiate over price and level of service provided.

#### Recommendations

8. City Executive Board is requested to agree that:

The Executive Director for City Regeneration is given delegated powers to award the contract to the tenderer who offers the most economically advantageous tender.
