# 2010/2011 Commissioning

#### Introduction

In a report to Executive Board on 10<sup>th</sup> September 2007 it was agreed to commit a large percentage of the grants budget, over a 3 year period, through commissioning, to commence from the financial year 2008/09.

The commissioning period is for the following financial years:-

- 2008 / 2009
- 2009 / 2010
- 2010 / 2011

On 4<sup>th</sup> February 2008 Executive Board agreed the organisations that fall into this process and approved the amount of grant funding to each for the three years.

We are now entering into the third year of the commissioning process. Officers will be meeting with commissioned organisations in the new year to discuss work plans for 2010/2011 and each will be looked at within the context of value for money and ensuring that services commissioned are in line with our corporate priorities.
