### **Councillors declaring interests**

#### **General duty**

You must declare any disclosable pecuniary interests when the meeting reaches the item on the agenda headed "Declarations of Interest" or as soon as it becomes apparent to you.

#### What is a disclosable pecuniary interest?

Disclosable pecuniary interests relate to your\* employment; sponsorship (ie payment for expenses incurred by you in carrying out your duties as a councillor or towards your election expenses); contracts; land in the Council's area; licenses for land in the Council's area; corporate tenancies; and securities. These declarations must be recorded in each councillor's Register of Interests which is publicly available on the Council's website.

#### **Declaring an interest**

Where any matter disclosed in your Register of Interests is being considered at a meeting, you must declare that you have an interest. You should also disclose the nature as well as the existence of the interest. If you have a disclosable pecuniary interest, after having declared it at the meeting you must not participate in discussion or voting on the item and must withdraw from the meeting whilst the matter is discussed.

#### Members' Code of Conduct and public perception

Even if you do not have a disclosable pecuniary interest in a matter, the Members' Code of Conduct says that a member "must serve only the public interest and must never improperly confer an advantage or disadvantage on any person including yourself" and that "you must not place yourself in situations where your honesty and integrity may be questioned". The matter of interests must be viewed within the context of the Code as a whole and regard should continue to be paid to the perception of the public.

\*Disclosable pecuniary interests that must be declared are not only those of the member her or himself but also those member's spouse, civil partner or person they are living with as husband or wife or as if they were civil partners.

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#### Introduction and background

- On 20<sup>th</sup> February 2023, the City of Oxford Licensed Taxicab Association ("COLTA") submitted an application requesting to vary the Hackney Carriage Table of Fares by:
  - a. increasing the tariffs by an average of 5.6%, and;
  - b. increasing the additional charges by an average of 70%, and;
  - c. removing the restriction of the highest Tariff (Tariff Three) from the Christmas and New Year period only, to allow its usage every day between 02:00 and 06:00 hours.

A copy of the application outlining reasons for the requested variation can be found at **Appendix One**.

2. The application states that the variation has been submitted to:

"recover the significant cost increases suffered since early 2021 (in a significant increase in RPI)."

And;

"anticipate the costs involved to modernise the vehicle fleet so that new emission controls within the City can be achieved."

- 3. Under section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 the Council may set the fares for Hackney Carriages within its area. The section sets out the parameters for fixing and amending the fares/tariffs for licensed hackney carriages by the Council, this includes the requirement of a public consultation and consideration of any response.
- 4. The Council may not set fares for journeys outside its area. The fare for journeys ending outside the area may be negotiated separately between the hirer and driver but are outside the control of the Council.

# **Application for the Variation of Hackney Carriage Table of Fares**

5. The effect of the proposed variation when comparing it with the current table of fares can be found below:

6. The application also proposes variations to the timings in which different Tariffs can be used, including the proposal that 'Tariff Three' is to be used every day.



#### **Proposed Tariff Increases**

- 7. A copy of the current Hackney Carriage Table of Fares can be found at **Appendix**Three and a Table of Fares demonstrating the proposed variation can be found at **Appendix Four**.
- 8. The Committee should note that, due to the time required to carry out a statutory public consultation, any variation, is unlikely to take effect before December 2023.

#### Proposed usage changes

The usage changes proposed significantly increase the use of Tariff Three. This
 Tariff was previously restricted to only the Christmas and New Year periods while
 the proposal removes that restriction, allowing use every day of the year between
 02:00 and 06:00 hours.



#### **Comparisons with Other Authorities**

- 10. A copy of Hackney Carriage tariff charts from other Licensing Authorities can be found at **Appendix Five**.
- 11. On average, Oxford City Councils Hackney Carriage Table of Fares ranks as 96th most expensive in the Country according to Private Hire and Taxi Monthly statistics. When compared to other districts South Oxfordshire; Vale of White Horse; Leeds

City, Wokingham Borough; Milton Keynes all ranking higher. Cherwell; West Oxfordshire; Birmingham City; Cambridge City; Luton and Sheffield City all ranking lower than Oxford City.

#### **View of Oxford City Council Licensing**

- 12. The licensing department agree that an increase in Tariffs is necessary to support the trade, particularly considering the supporting evidence regarding CPI and RPI provided in the application.
- 13. Oxford City Councils Table of Fares is not an outlier in terms of tariff costs across the country: as it ranks 96<sup>th</sup> most expensive of 317 Councils, an increase is not fundamentally unfair on customers.
- 14. Concerns about the inconsistent milage charges proposed, namely charging more per mile for travelling four miles than three.
- 15. Regarding the approximate 15x increase of use for Tariff Three: this change will impact the night time economy and early morning commuters.
  - Hackney Carriage Vehicles operating between 02:00 and 06:00 hours have a crucial role to play in the safe dispersal of the night time economy. An increase in cost to the travelling public during these times may negatively impact this role, as intoxicated or vulnerable people may avoid this safe dispersal option if the cost is too high.

#### Consultation

16. Should the Committee approve a variation to the Hackney Carriage Table of Fares, a public notice will be required in a local newspaper providing details of the proposed variation, and a period of 28 days will commence for a public consultation.

#### **Financial implications**

17. There are no financial implications to the Council.

#### Legal issues

- 18. If no objection to the proposed table of fares/ variation is made within the period specified in the newspaper notice, or if all objections are withdrawn, the table of fares/ variation will come into operation on the date of the expiration of the period specified in the notice or the date of withdrawal of the objection or, if more than one, of the last objection, whichever date is the later.
- 19. If an objection is made and is not withdrawn, the Council would have to set a further date, not later than two months after the first specified date, on which the table of fares, will come into force with or without modifications after consideration of the objections.
- 20. The requirements for a fair consultation are that: (i) the consultation takes place at a time when proposals are still at a formative stage; (ii) the proposer gives sufficient information regarding the proposal to consider intelligent consideration and

response; (iii) adequate time must be given for consideration and response; and (iv) the product of consultation must be conscientiously taken into account.

# **Equality impact**

21. There are no adverse impacts anticipated on anyone with protected characteristics.

# **Environmental implications**

22. There are few environmental considerations arising directly from this report and no impact is anticipated on the environment.

#### **APPENDIX ONE**

#### City of Oxford Licensed Taxicab Association (C. O. L. T. A.)

Hackney Carriage Licensed Trade – Application for Variation of Tariffs.

We have prepared an application to vary the tariffs to be approved by Oxford City Council. Key elements to this application:

- 1. The last variation was approved in September 2020 and implemented on 1st May 2021.
- 2. The last application was based on CPI and RPI Data from November 2013 to December 2018. This application looks at the changes between November 2020 to December 2022
- 3. The application seeks to:
  - a. Recover the significant cost increases suffered since early 2021 (in a significant increase in RPI).
  - b. Anticipate the costs involved to modernise the vehicle fleet so that new emission controls within the City can be achieved.

#### **CPI** and RPI

- 1. Consumer Price Index from November 2020 108.9 (taken roughly just over a month after from last application was approved) to December 2022 127.6. **An increase of 18.7%.**
- 2. Retail Price Index from November 2020 293.5 to December 2022 360.4. **An increase of 66.9%.**
- 3. The average of the two indices can be accepted as 42.8%.

#### Tariff 3 proposal

The Hackney Carriage trade in Oxford currently uses tariff 3 only during the festive period of Christmas and the turn of the New Year. Colta proposes to incorporate the usage of tariff 3 on a daily basis from 02:00 a.m to 06:00 a.m, in line with other cities such as London, Leeds, Liverpool, Sheffield, Swindon, Bristol, Birmingham, South Oxfordshire and many others.

#### Modernisation of Vehicle Fleet to meet new emission standards.

- 1. The further significant cost increase relevant to this application is the previously mentioned need to modernise the fleet with low or zero emission vehicles and this is anticipated by the move to the new London Electric Vehicle taxi costing at a price of £70,000 plus interest.
- 2. The Council will appreciate that this very significant investment can only be achieved by the ability of the trade to earn sufficient funds to provide for the investment either by way of loan repayment, vehicle leasing or lump sum payment.
- 3. It is essential that the trade is able to prepare for this change now, well in advance of the deadline for introduction of these vehicles and an element of this and future tariff changes needs to provide for the exceptional investment required.

Many of our passengers appreciate that drivers cannot simply absorb the rising cost of fuel, let alone coupled with the overall rising cost of living.

The proposed increase will see the initial hire price rise on tariff 1 and on tariff 2 (after 2 miles). Tariff 3 is unchanged. We also propose to increase the hire price after 4 miles on all three tariffs from the current rate which is £3 a mile to £3.30 per mile, which is a 10% increase in line with the current inflation.

During unsocial hours, which is it the very late hours from 2 am onwards, we propose to regularise the use of tariff 3 up until 06:00 a.m.

1. This report is intended to inform the General Purposes Licensing Committee about progress with and plans regarding some key topics within the remit of the Council's "Miscellaneous Licensing" functions.

### **Street Trading**

- The revised Street Trading Policy 2023 ("The Policy") came into force on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 following review of the 2020 Policy and a consultation process. A new feature of the Policy concerns the use of single use plastic (including polystyrene).
- 3. As reported to Council in July, steps have been taken to ensure that street traders are no longer using single use plastic, in line with the updated Policy. Inspection visits to 90% of street traders found that 25% of these were still using single use plastic. All respective Consent Holders were advised that they were breaching a condition of the Policy and it is intended that follow-up visits will be carried out in October this year.
- 4. In the current financial year two Consent holders have ceased trading, one has changed site and two have commenced trading, following Sub

Committee approval. The St Aldate's fixed site (previously Gore's Van) currently is vacant and will be advertised shortly.

### **Extended Temporary Pavement Licensing provisions**

- 5. On the 10<sup>th</sup> August 2023 the government replaced the existing Pavement Licensing scheme with near-identical regulations, the Business and Planning Act 2020 (Pavement Licences) (Coronavirus) (Amendment) Regulations 2023/900which commenced on10th August 2023 (published 15<sup>th</sup>). All existing licences expire on 30th September 2023, with those now made under the new regulations being valid until 30th September 2024. The fee for a licence has also remained the same.
- 6. This late government legislation change has left just over one month for around 100 existing licence holders to re-apply and gain a new licence. As there are statutory processing requirements, the latest application date to obtain a valid renewed licence before the expiry of an existing licence is 15th September.
- 7. Businesses were advised to submit a renewal application once the legislation was amended and approximately one third of licence holders have re-applied as of the date of this report. Due to the late change, it is anticipated that many businesses will no longer be in possession of a valid pavement licence on 1st October Those that have not made a renewal application by this date will be advised to remove their pavement furniture until they have applied for a new licence.
- 8. A new e-form based application process for Pavement Licence customers was introduced this year which has been used by approximately a third of applicants to date. Its use brings an improvement in customer service and an efficiency in licence processing in line with the Council's Citizen's Experience Strategy.

### **Animal Licensing**

- 9. There are currently 8 Oxford businesses licensable as Animal Establishments (selling, boarding, day care, exhibiting) and all licenses required re-inspection in 2022-23.
- 10. Due to a change in statutory competency requirements the Council outsourced 2023 inspections to South and Vale District Council. Inspections were conducted in May and June, with updated licenses now having been issued. All businesses were found to be compliant with legal requirements. Training is planned to ensure officer competency for this role in future.

#### Finance Issues

11. In previous years a New Burden Section 30 Grant of £5,063 was used to help offset increased workload pressures created by the Pavement Licensing regime. No Grant has been provided for the current year and as the fee has remained the same the work has had to be carried out within existing staff resources.

### Legal Issues

12. The enforcement of legal requirements made under national legislation is subject to the Council's Corporate Enforcement Policy. Licensing officers have regard to this Policy for example in using education, encouragement, and enforcement to uphold statutory requirements and encourage good practice.

### **Equality impact**

13. There are no adverse impacts anticipated on anyone with protected characteristics.

### **Environmental implications**

14. There are few environmental considerations arising directly from this report and a positive impact is anticipated on the environment particularly from the reduction in the use of single use plastic (including polystyrene).

Cllr Miles raised a question on bike taxis.

In response to questions, the Supervising Senior Licensing Officer explained that similar queries had been raised in the past but fell outside the remit of the Authority due to bicycles being unable to meet the criteria of a 'vehicle' under the licensing legislation, particularly in regard to safety requirements. He advised that licensing bicycles through the current regime would require substantial work and changes to the policy, however initial proposals that would explore how other authorities allowed similar schemes could be a considerable first steps.

The Committee requested that Licensing Officers explored ways that would enable the Authority to licence bicycles as a method of public transportation within the city to be brought before the Committee for discussions at a future meeting.
