Decision and Reasons of the Sub-Committee

1. The Sub-Committee considered all submissions, both written and oral. It also had regard to the relevant Home Office Guidance and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy.
2. The Sub-Committee noted the amendments to the application reducing the licensable hours and licensable activities and including new measures in the operating schedule.
3. The Sub-Committee found that these amendments should address the concerns of the interested parties and ensure the premises operates within the Licensing Objectives. In this respect it was particularly significant that none of the Responsible Authorities had objected to the application.

4. The Sub-Committee were aware that the premises fell within the area of the City Centre Special Saturation Policy but found that with the agreed measures the activities applied for were unlikely to add to cumulative impact problems.
5. The Sub-Committee were satisfied that the application was otherwise in accordance with the Licensing Objectives.

The Application was therefore **GRANTED** as amended.
