31	recyclable waste. This is to be the primary focus in the coming months. In addition to the composition study, the waste processed by N&P is analysed and the percentage of contamination recorded. The below graph shows the % of contamination each year and shows that the first month of this year has reached 11.84%. This is not the full picture as it is a drop compared to F and March in which both months exceeded 15%. In terms of performance, following the notable increase of household waste during the early stages of COVID lockdown, the subsequent 2 years have seen positive improvements in almost all areas. Domestic food waste saw a notable increase in tonnage in 2022/23, but this is still lower than 2019/20. The focus on food waste saw a highlighted above will hopefully influence a reduction in this going forward.
