Introduction and background

1. This report is made to the Licensing and Gambling Acts Casework Sub-Committee so it may determine, in accordance with its powers and the Licensing Act 2003, whether to grant the variation of a Premises Licence to Heat Afro Lounge.

Other Relevant Considerations

- 11. The Sub-Committee is reminded of its responsibilities under the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (to co-operate in the reduction of crime and disorder in Oxford) and the Human Rights Act 1998 (which guarantees the right to a fair hearing for all parties in the determination of their civil rights, and also provides for the protection of property, which may include licences in existence, and the protection of private and family life) when considering the fair balance between the interests of the applicant and the rights of local residents. Any decision taken by the Sub-Committee must be necessary and proportionate to the objectives being pursued.
- 12. Members are reminded that whenever they make a decision under the Licensing Act 2003, they have a duty to act with a view to promoting the licensing objectives.

- 13. When considering any representations, only those issues relating to the four licensing objectives should be considered and appropriate weight given to the importance and relevance of each representation.
- 14. In making its decision, Members must also have regard to the Home Office statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 15. The Sub-Committee must take such of the following steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives:
 - a. Grant the licence in accordance with the application.
 - Modify the conditions of the operating schedule by altering or omitting or adding to them.
 - c. Exclude or restrict from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
 - d. Reject the whole of the application.

The Sub-Committee may also grant the licence subject to different conditions for different parts of the premises or the different licensable activities.

- 16. Members are asked to note that they may not modify the conditions or reject whole or part of the application merely because they consider it desirable to do so. It must be appropriate to do so in order to promote the licensing objectives. Any such step must relate to a relevant representation made.
- 17. If Members grant the application, the details of the operating schedule will be incorporated into the licence as conditions. The licence will also be subject to certain mandatory conditions.

18. Members should note that the applicant or persons making representations have the right of appeal against the decision made by the Sub-Committee.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.
- 3. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
 - Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
- 5. For example state type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence;
 - (a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
 - (b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. 1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - 2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:
 - games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - 2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:
 - a) a holographic mark; or
 - b) an ultraviolet feature.

- 6. The responsible person must ensure that
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 7. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1:
 - (a) duty is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) permitted price is the price found by applying the formula: P=D+(DxV) where:
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence:
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) relevant person means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) valued added tax means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
 - 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
 - 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (the first day) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (the second day) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 8. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that all staff employed at the premises whose duties include the sale or supply of alcohol shall undertake and complete a relevant programme of training prior to them being authorised to sell or supply alcohol. Such training shall consist of providing staff with an understanding of:
 - The need to ensure the responsible sale and supply of alcohol
 - The need to refuse the sale and supply of alcohol to persons who are intoxicated or underage
 - The need to seek credible age verification from persons seeking to be sold or supplied alcohol who may appear under the age of 18 years old

The content of the training programme shall be agreed with the Force Licensing Officer of Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority prior to implementation.

Records of the training programme shall be maintained and made available to Authorised Officers upon request.

The Premises Licence holder shall provide a "refresher" training session to all relevant staff members as and when deemed necessary on a case by case evaluation, but as a minimum requirement the refresher training session shall be provided to all staff on at least one occasion every six months.

- 9. A Premises Daily Register shall be held at the premises. This Register shall be maintained for a rolling minimum period of 12 months, and shall record:
 - The name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day.
 - The name of the person authorising the sale of alcohol each day.
 - All calls made to the premises where there is a complaint made by a resident or neighbour of noise, nuisance or anti-social behaviour by persons attending or leaving the premises. This shall record the details of the caller, the time and date of the call and the time and date of the incident about which the call is made and any actions taken to deal with the call.
 - Any refusals on grounds of age and/or intoxication (to include date, time, member of staff involved, reason for refusal as well as a brief physical description of the person refused)
 - The name, SIA number, start and finish time of anyone employed in a security role for that day
 - Any use of force by SIA registered staff in the effective management of the premises or in ejecting
 persons from the premises (to include date, time, member of staff involved, reason for force as well as
 a brief physical description of the person refused)
 - Weekly checks of the CCTV, to ensure it is fully operational and any faults are dealt with including the time of the check and the person that carried it out.
 - Any calls to or visits by Thames Valley Police in relation to any crime and disorder or like related matter.

The Designated Premises Supervisor shall check the Premises Daily Register on a weekly basis ensuring that it is completed and up-to-date, sign the Premises Daily Register each time that it is checked, and make the Premises Daily Register available for inspection by any Authorised Officer throughout the trading hours of the premises.

- 10. The premises shall implement written policies and procedural statements and/or management action plans. Such documents shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - CCTV
 - Conditions of Entry
 - Crowd Dispersal
 - Child Sexual Exploitation & Vulnerable Persons
 - Noise
 - Queue Management
 - Responsible Service of Alcohol
 - Security Measures
 - Underage Sales & False Identification
 - Zero Tolerance Drugs

The above policies and procedural statements shall be "live" documents, subject to amendment following consultation with the Licensing Authority, Environmental Health Department, and Thames Valley Police.

- 11. The CCTV policy shall incorporate the following basic requirements:
 - Be switched on and fully operational when the licensable activities are being carried out.
 - Record for a minimum rolling period of 31 days
 - · Have a camera covering any entrance which will provide a facial shot of identification quality.
 - Have a means of copying any footage to another medium as evidence if requested by the Police
 - Have a member of staff working at all times whilst the licence is in operation that is able to operate the system and in particular be able to provide copies of any footage requested by The Police.
- 12. The policies / procedures referred to at Condition 10 shall be reviewed and amended at any time that the Premises Licence holder deems appropriate, but shall in any case be reviewed following any concerns being raised to the Premises Licence holder by any Authorised Officer. Such reviews when undertaken shall seek the advice of the Force Licensing Officer of Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority.
- 13. The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that all staff employed at the premises are aware and understanding of the policies / procedures referred to at Condition 10 and the content of such policies and procedures and that they carry out their duties in accordance with them. Any necessary and justifiable deviation from those agreed shall be fully documented within the Premises Daily Register.
- 14. No person shall be admitted to the premises less than one hour before cessation of the last licensable activity.
- 15. The premises shall be cleared of customers and closed 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last licensed activity.
- 16. The sale of alcohol shall only be to persons who are eating at the premises/ have placed an order, or are waiting to place an order for food.

I object strongly to this application by the Heat Afro Lounge to extend opening hours and host live/recorded music events, on the grounds of the extremely high levels of noise already coming from this establishment. The loud, thumping bass music is excessively and antisocially loud and disturbs residents in the area until late at night.

I have made two complaints to the Oxford Council Noise Pollution team about this establishment since it moved to 282 Cowley Road. I note that before that, when it was based at 189 Cowley Road, there were numerous ongoing complaints from the public about the excessive noise, underage drinking and associated antisocial behaviour. The Police I believe objected to extended licensing which was nevertheless granted. These issues appear to have just been 'kicked down the road' for other local residents to endure.

This bar is in reality a nightclub, fronted by a restaurant/takeaway business, that attracts passing custom by blaring music as loud as possible into the street. It has a garden at the back and the front doors are mainly open (as punters go in and out) so the noise is not contained indoors. The application is for the addition of live and recorded music events "indoors only" but that is not the case. In reality it is hosting outside music events very late at night. This noise affects local residents not only in the Cowley Road, but beyond in Southfield Road and Magdalen Road.

At the moment, the loud music seems to be restricted to Wednesday, Friday and Saturday nights and generally stops around 12.30am or a bit later. The application would extend this disturbance till the early hours during weekdays as well as weekends, which is unacceptable for working residents in the vicinity.

There don't appear to be any public notices about this new licence application, which I only happened to stumble upon by accident online. So this application is really flying 'under the radar' and I am quite sure that if other residents were aware of what is planned, they would also object strongly. I would ask why a decision that is so material to those living here is really not public but effectively concealed.

Obviously there has to be a balance between commercial and residential interests but it seems as though the rights of the local population are being stifled and ignored. It's no use saying that any noise issues will be handled by the appropriate council team. Any complaints are investigated after the fact and little if anything can be done. The fact of the matter is that if this application goes though, it will impact very negatively on the lives and wellbeing of local working residents who need to sleep at night in order to get up and go to work in the morning.

I have registered my objection on the online form but preferred to email my comments. I'd appreciate it if this email could be acknowledged, so I know it has been received, but please note that I do NOT want my comments or personal details to be made public.
