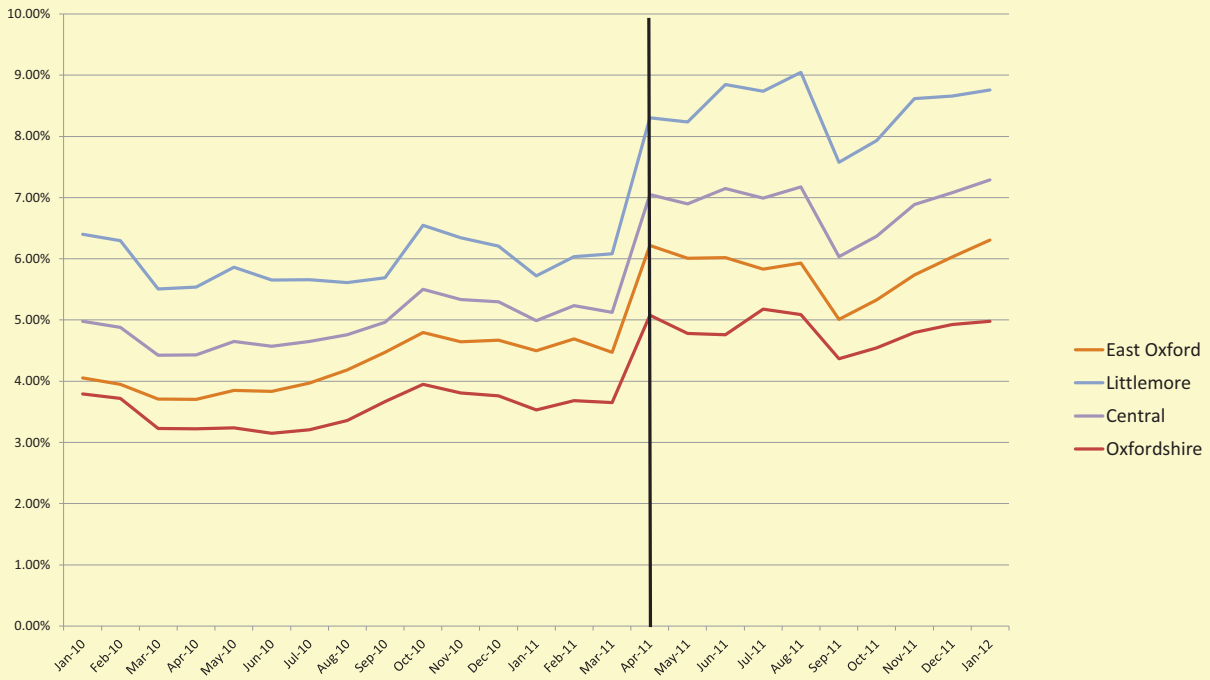
Oxfordshire NEET

It also includes those NEET whose destination has lapsed.

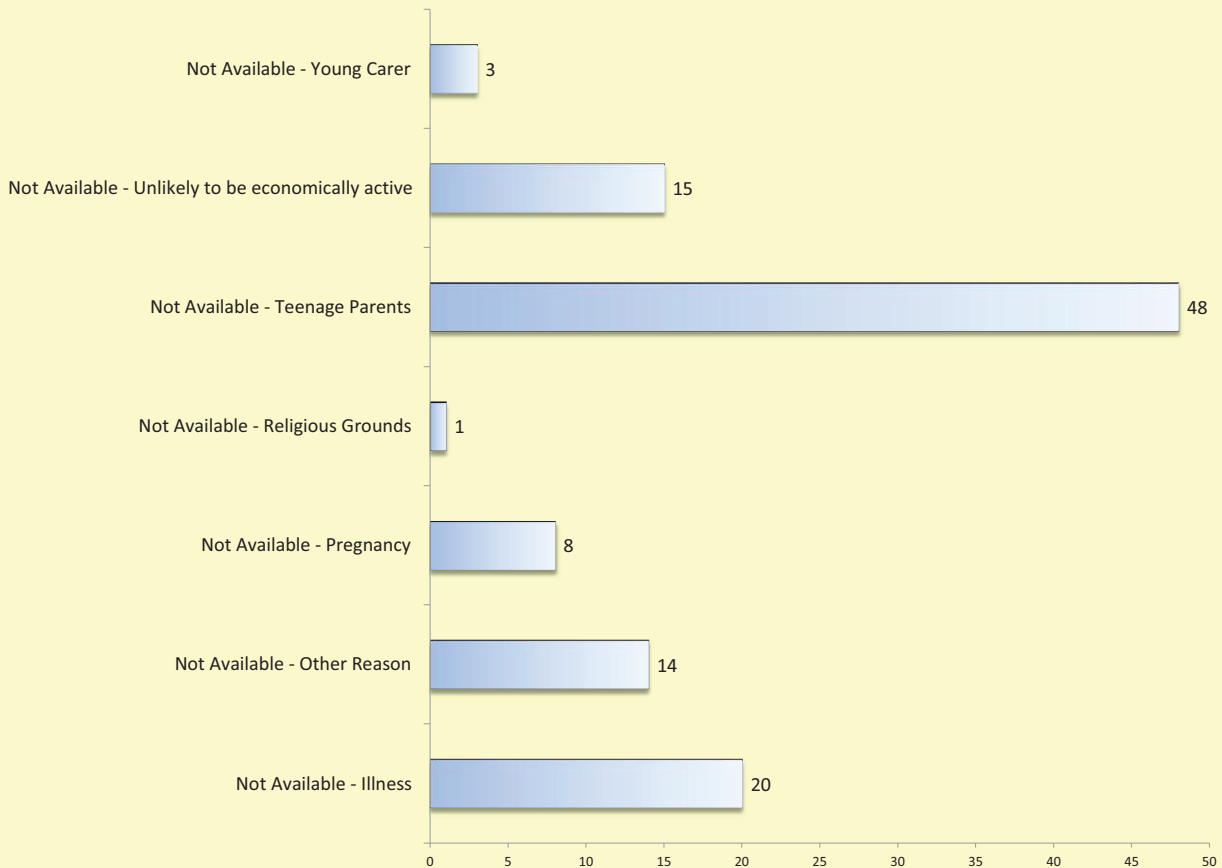


County and Central NEET since January 2010

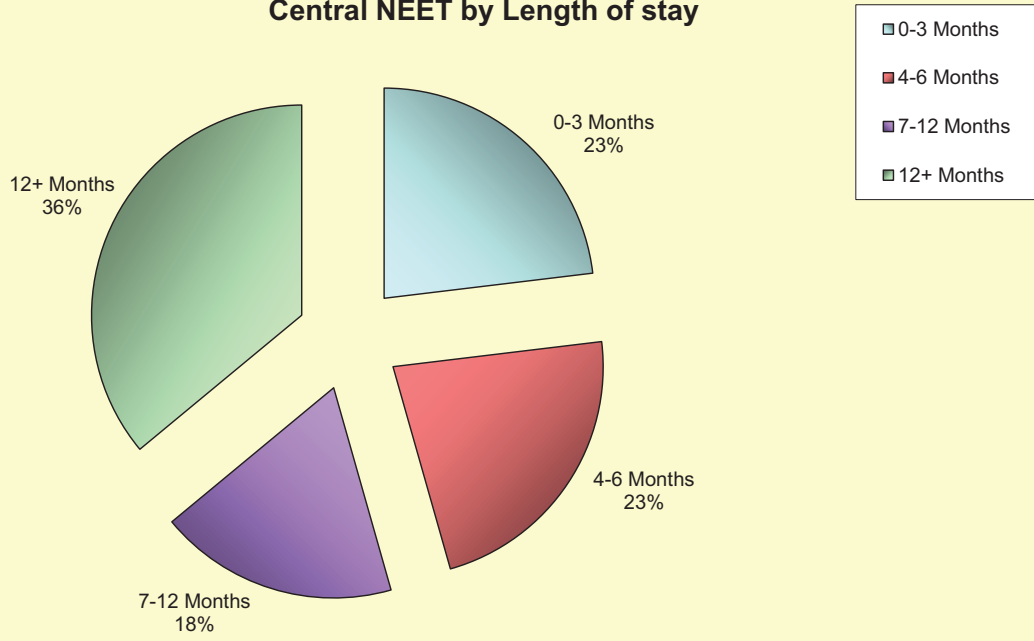


The jump in April is due to a change in recording criteria, from actual age to cohort age

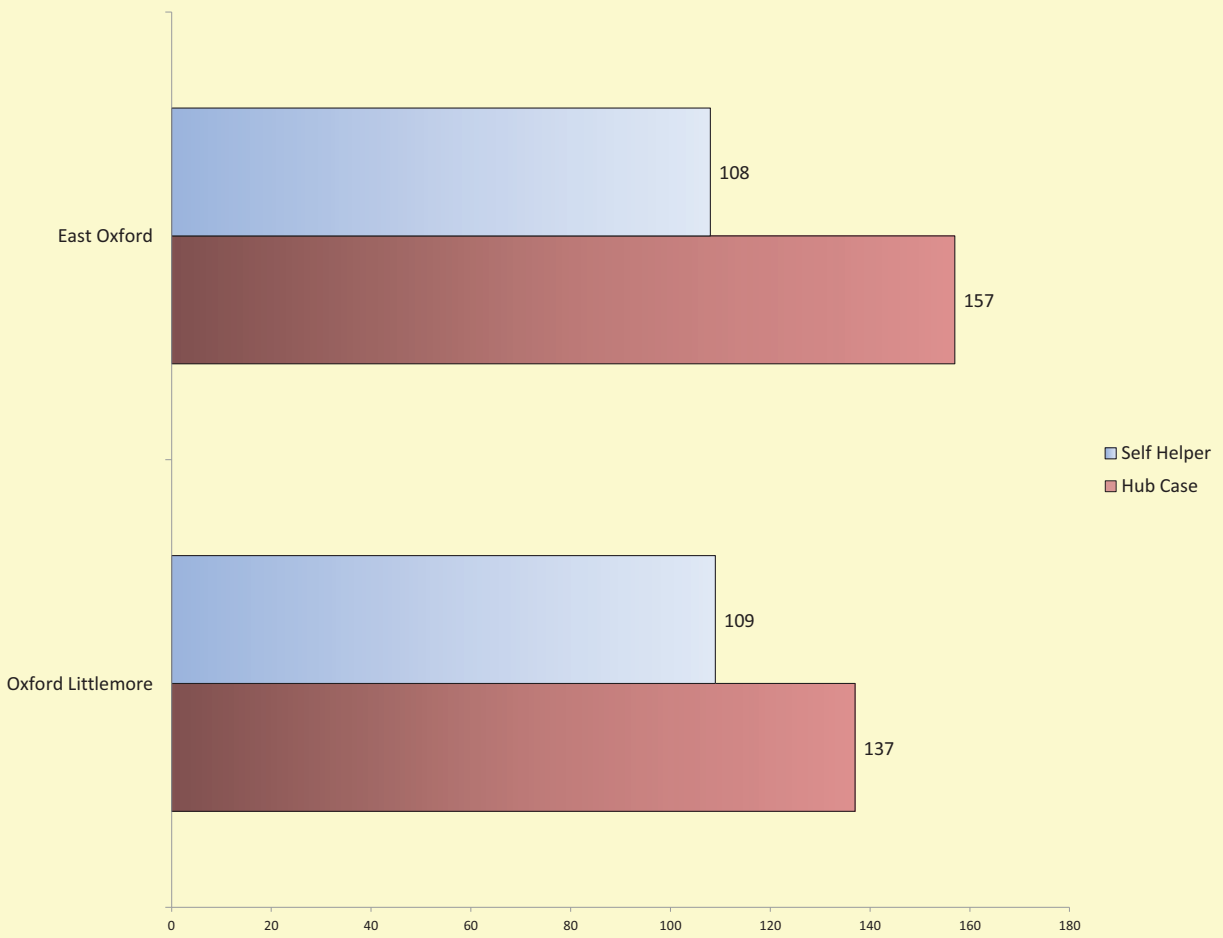


Central NEET by Length of stay

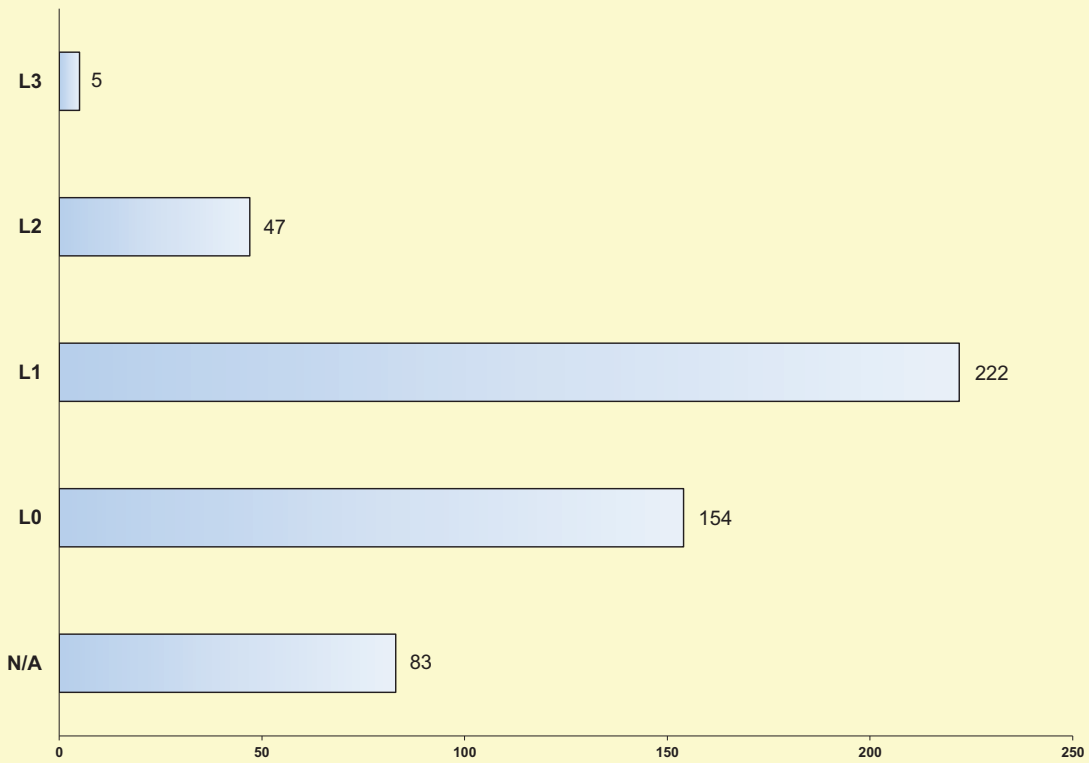


- 46% YP have been NEET for 6 months or less

- 36% have been NEET for 12+ months

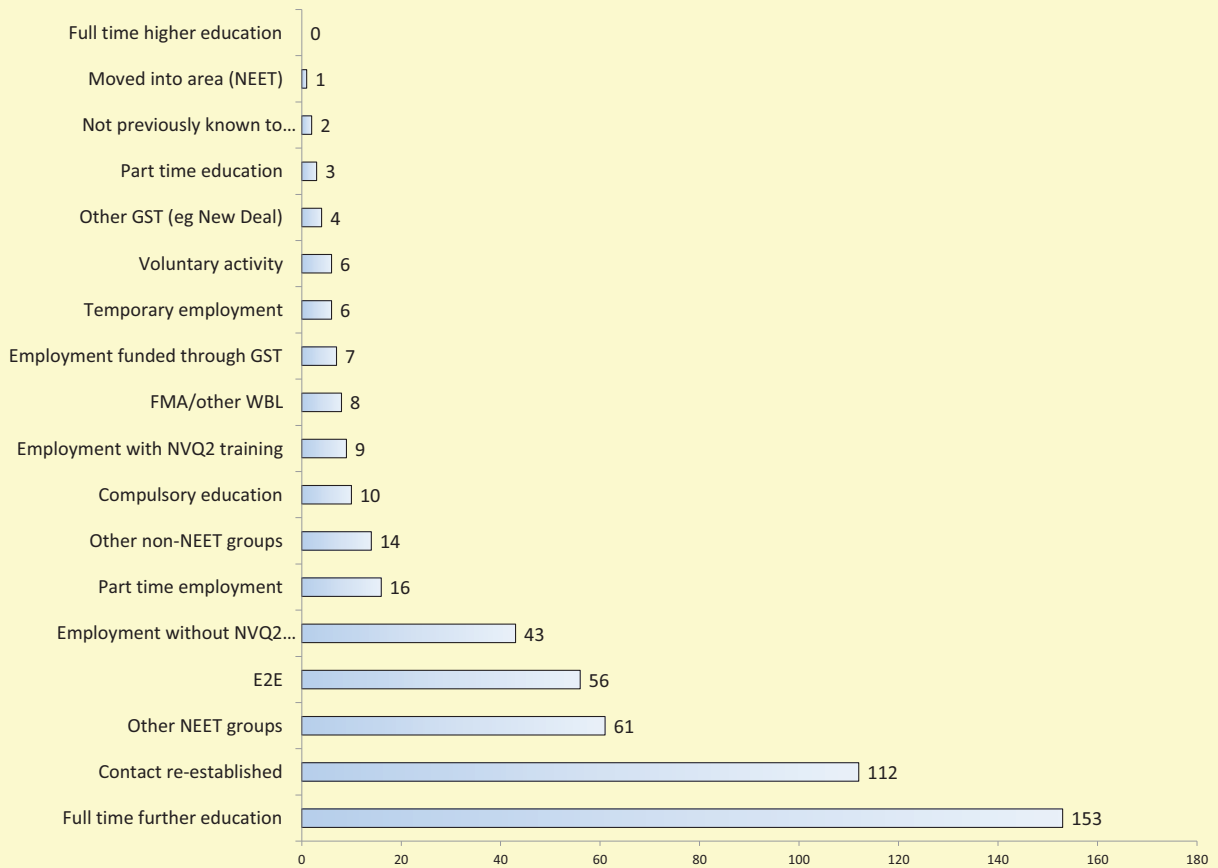
Central NEET by Hub Area and Responsible User



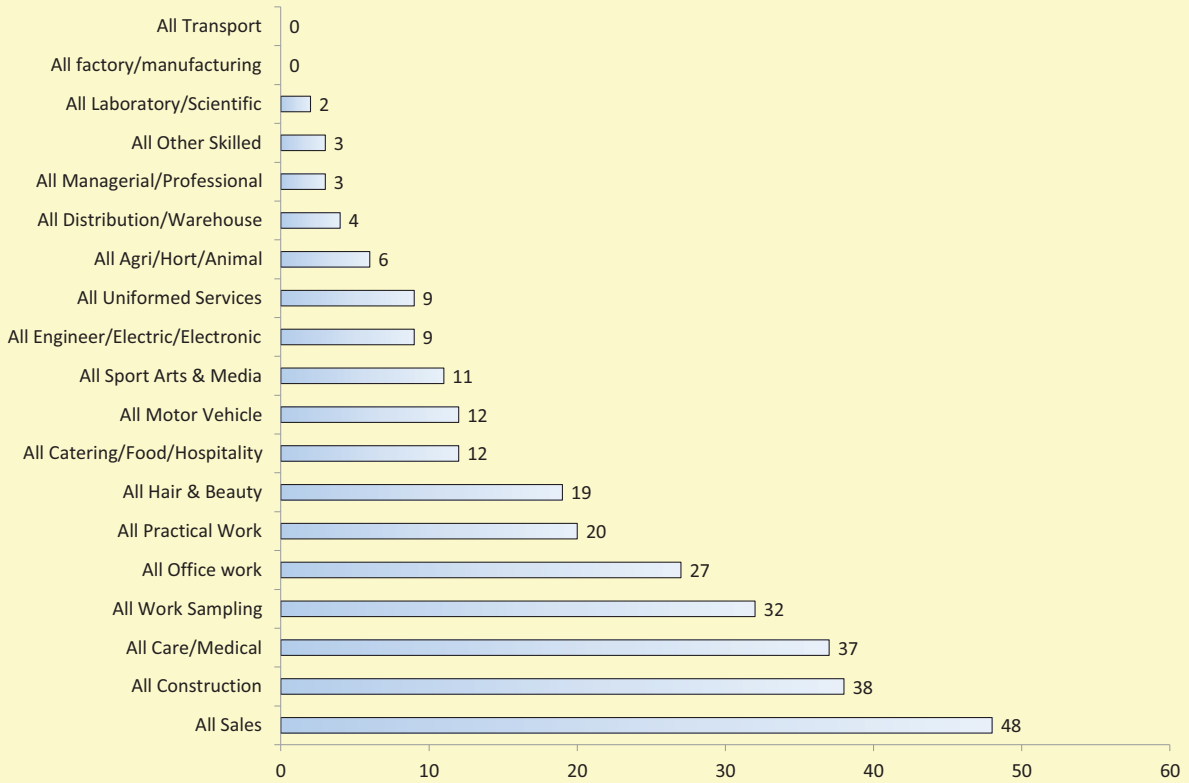
Central NEET - Existing Qualifications



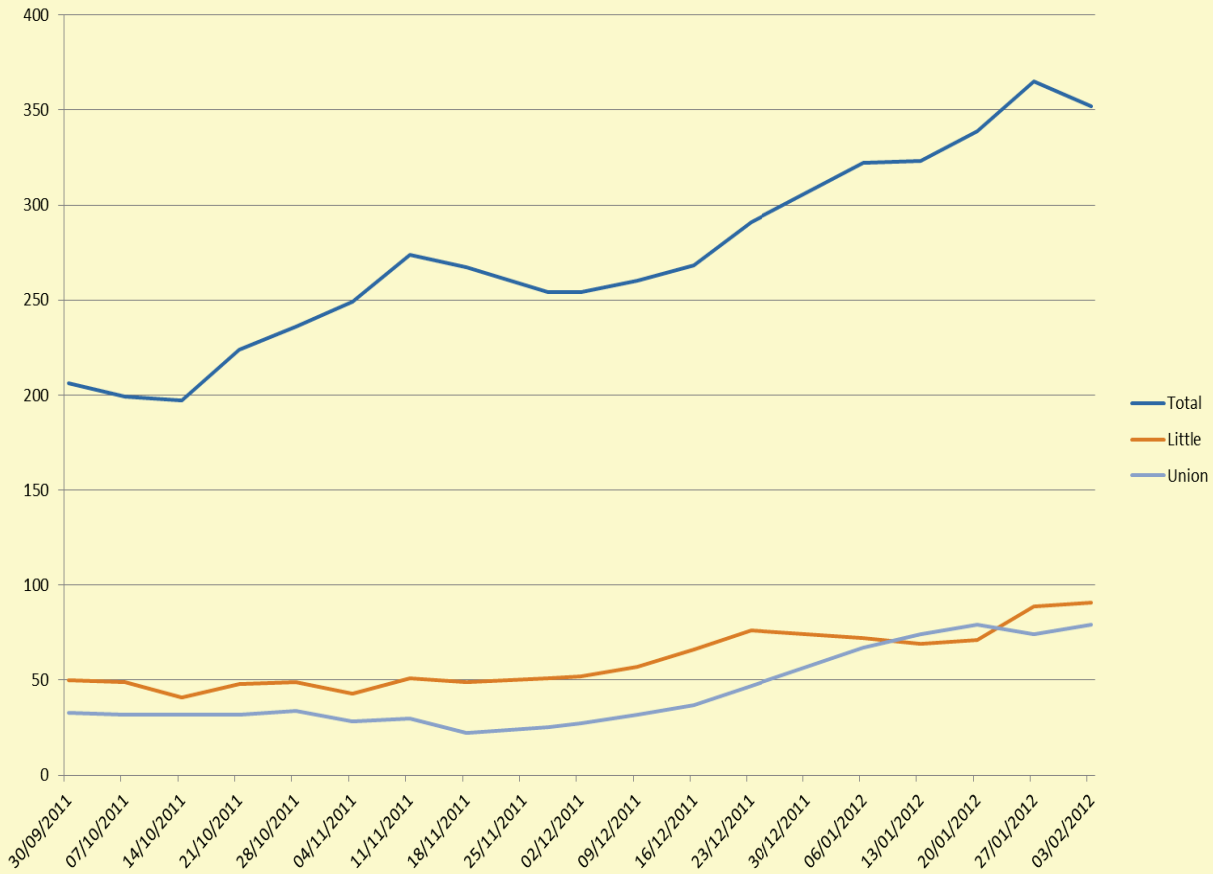
Previous Destinations of Central NEET



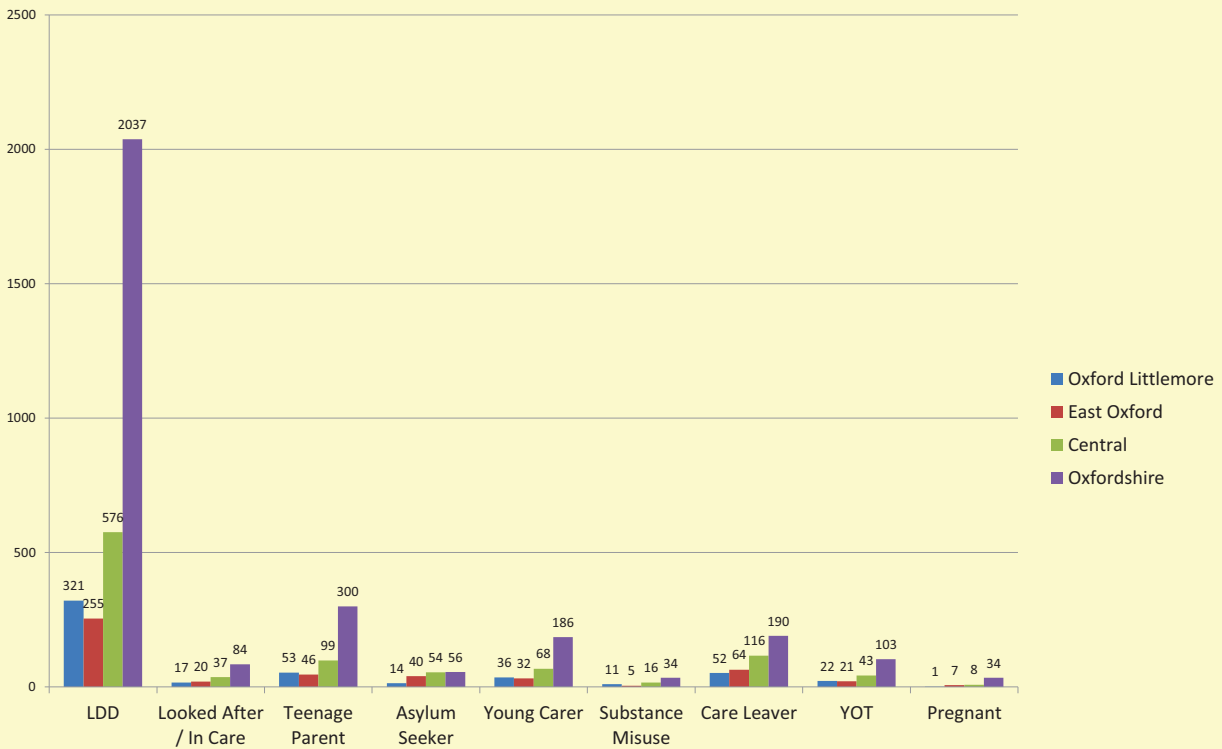
Occupational Choices of Central NEET



Central NEET Lapse Trend

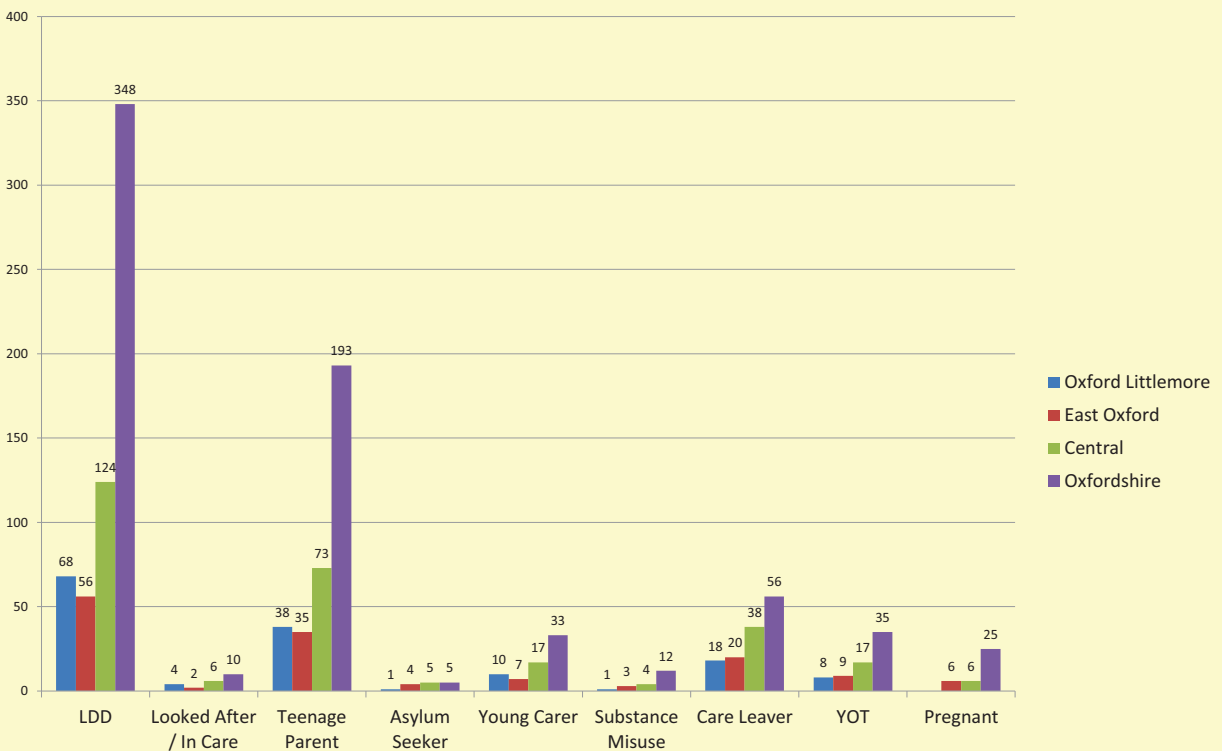

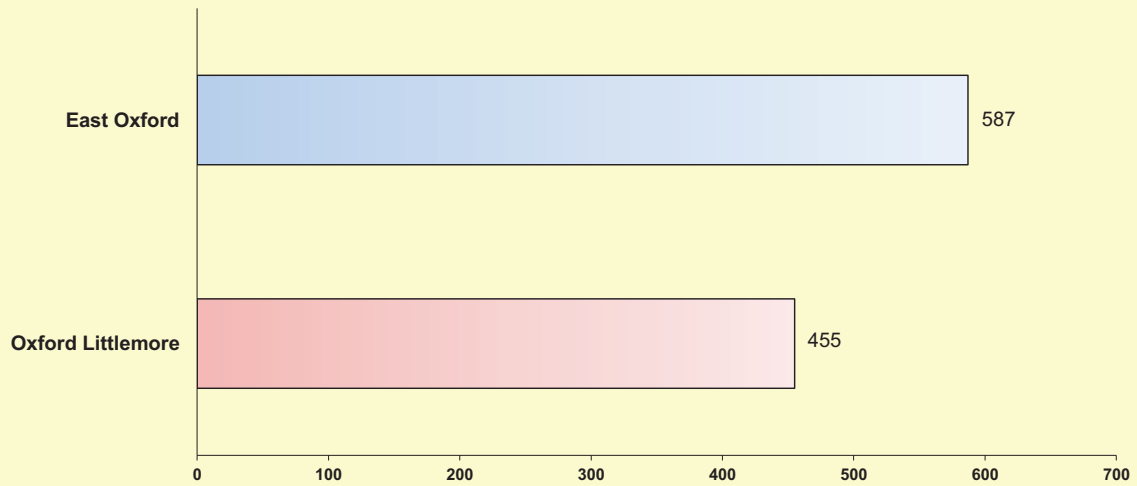
Vulnerable Groups in NEET



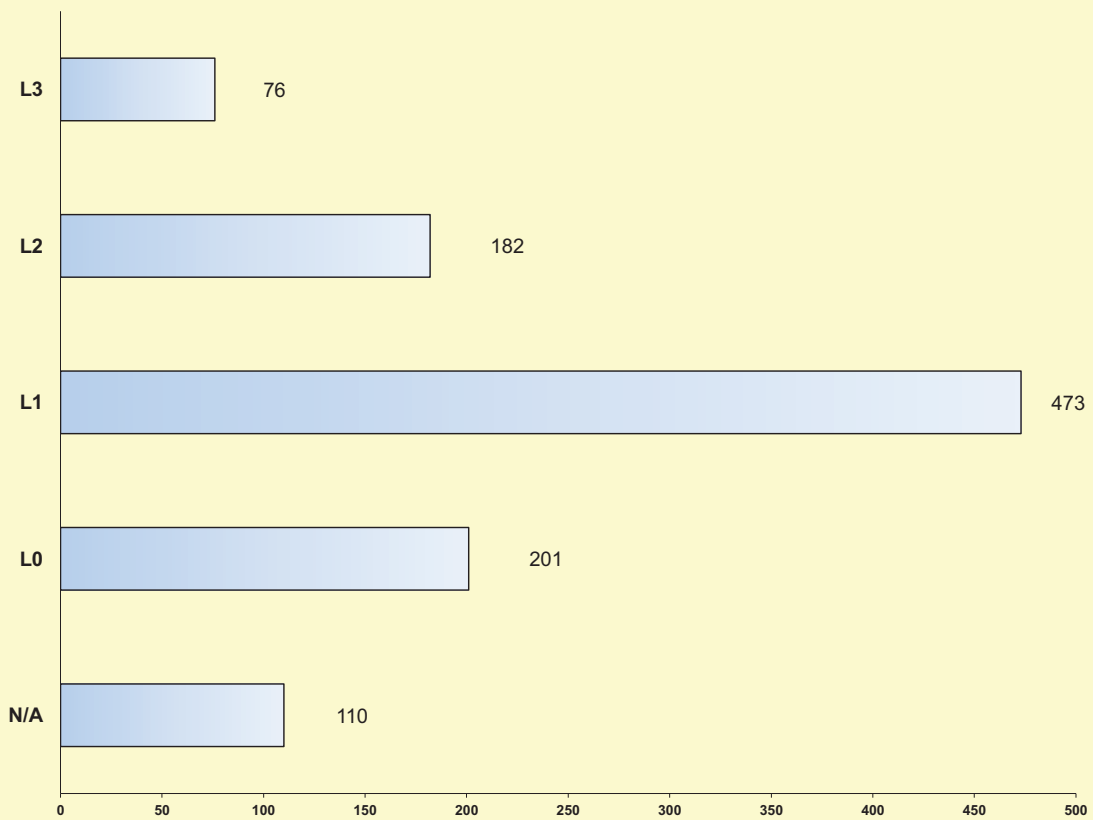
When looking at the vulnerable groups who are in NEET again the central area features the majority of Asylum Seekers and Care Leavers.

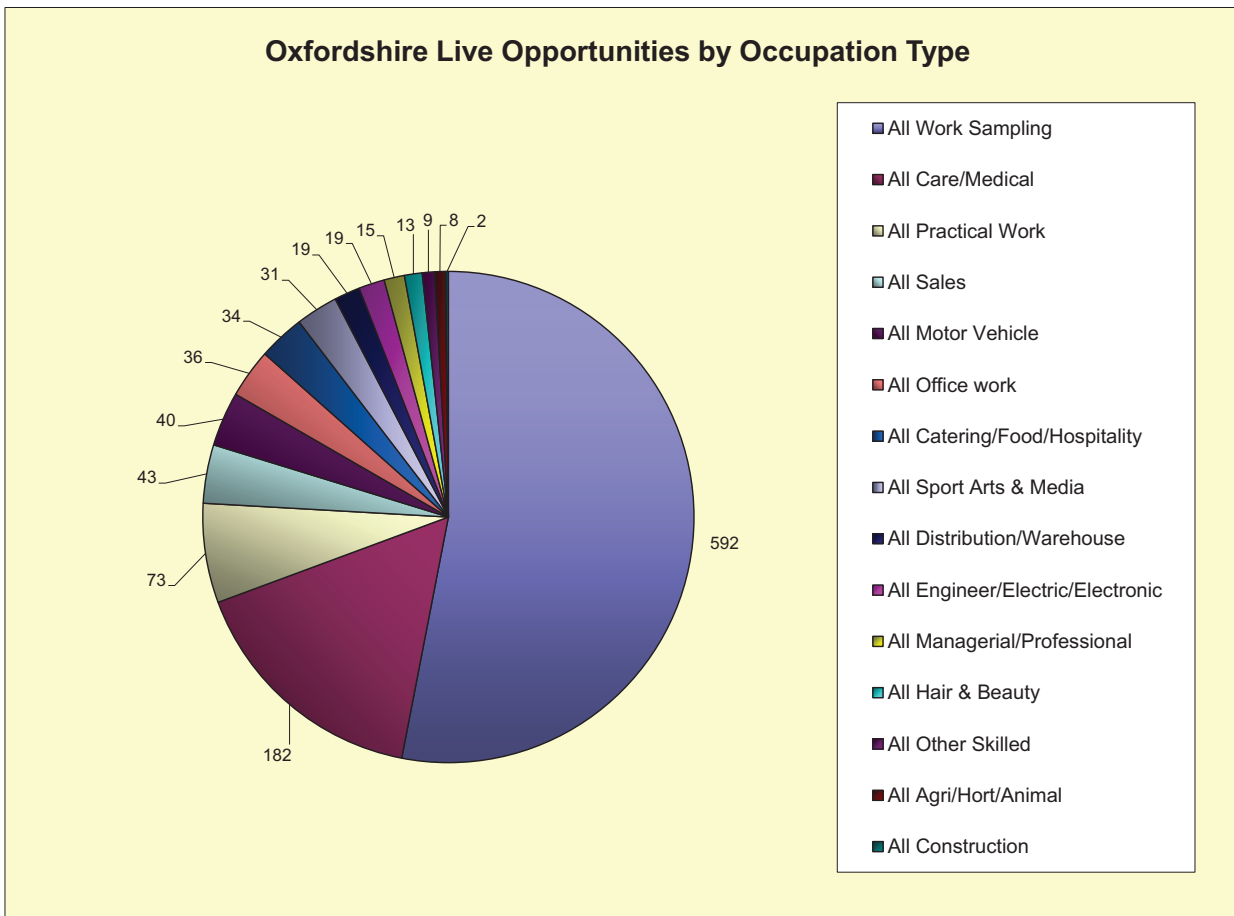
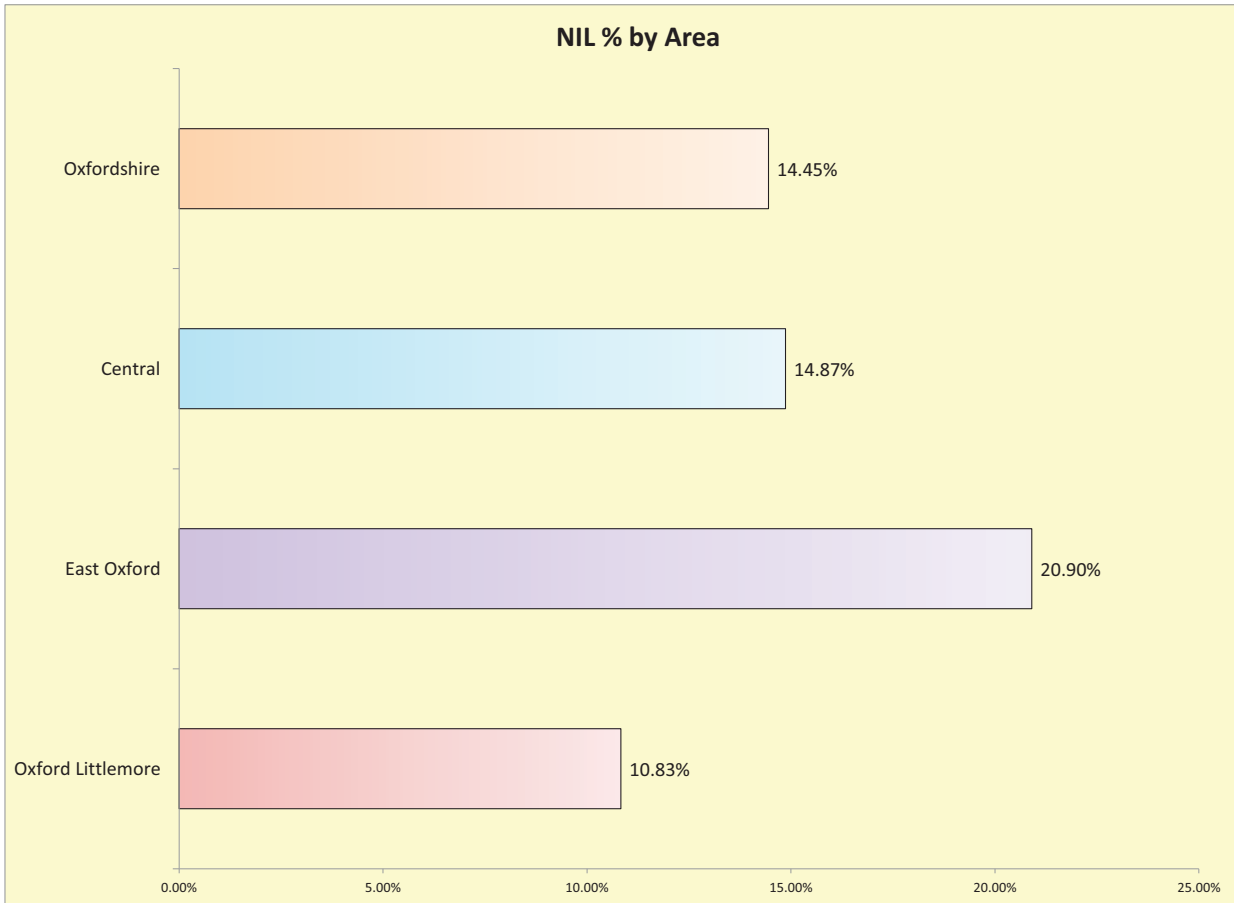


Central NIL by Hub

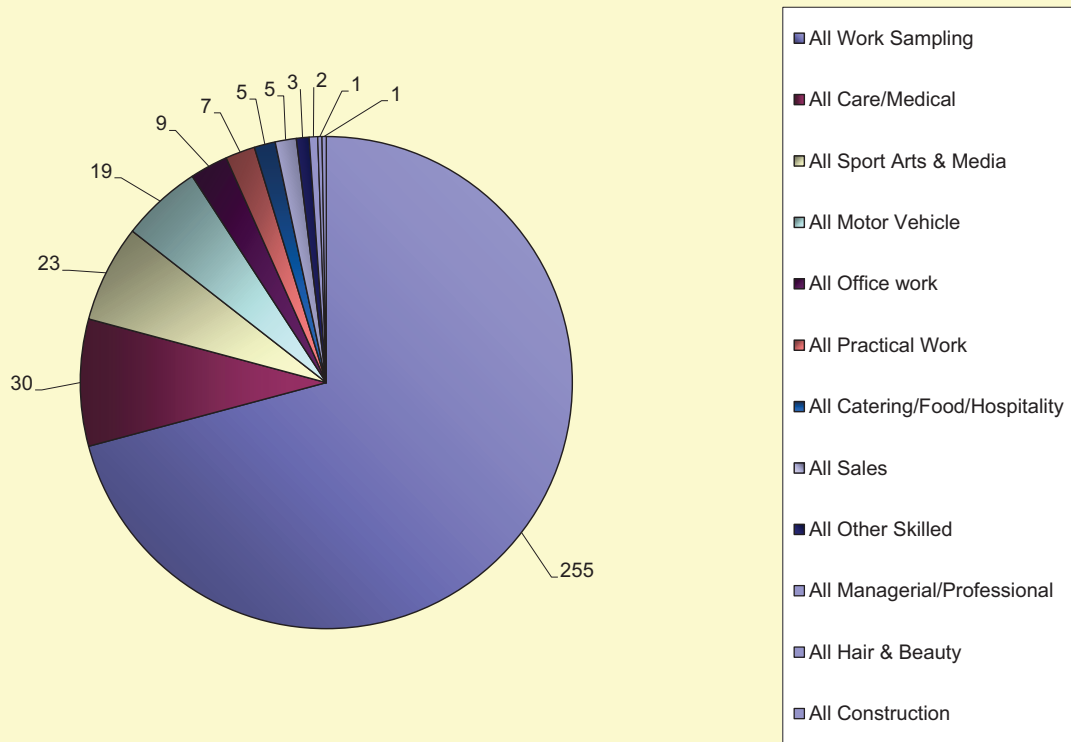


Central NIL - Existing Qualifications

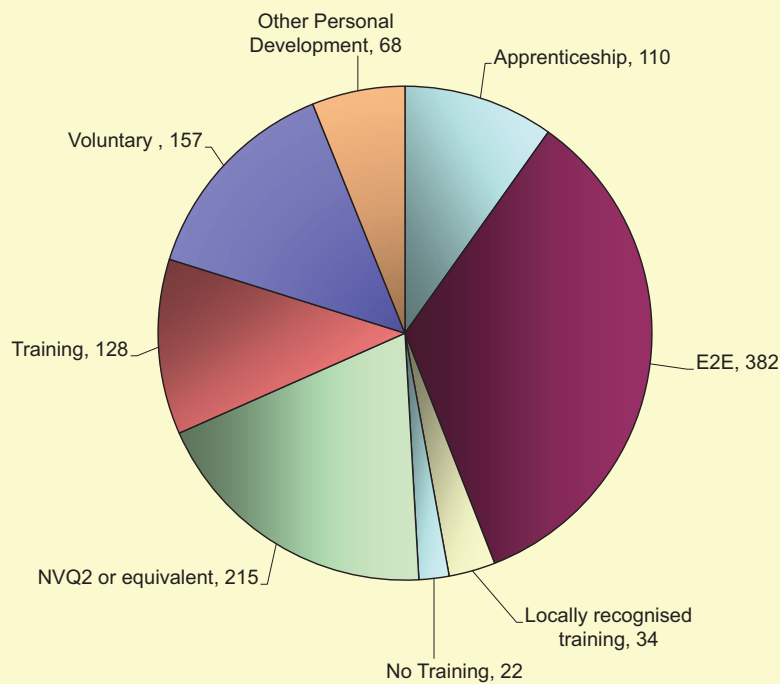




Central Live Opportunities by Occupation Type
