- **The Porch** - To support an Engagement and Development Coach so that they can continue to provide one-to-one support to homeless and vulnerably housed members with housing and employment.
- **The Story Museum** - To support the provision of 'Story Connectors', a free-to-access skills development programme for teenagers in Rose Hill and Barton, which helps them to build confidence in new skills, such as podcasting, film making and marketing.
- **Yellow Submarine Holidays** - To support the provision of 'Reach', a personal development project for adults with learning disabilities, which covers themes such as communication, assertiveness, cooking, wellbeing and an introduction to the workplace.
- **Young Women's Music Project** - To support the provision of weekly workshops which support the mental health of participants by providing an opportunity to make and record music.
