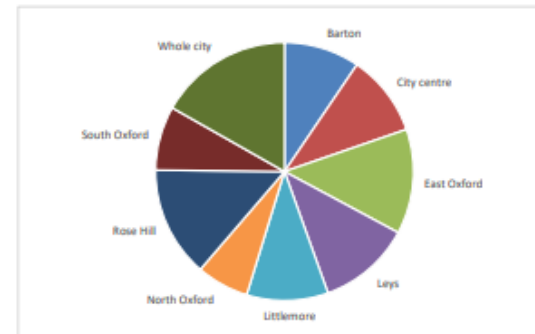
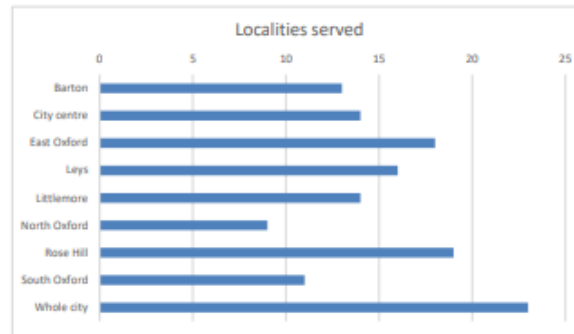
Self-identified indicators:

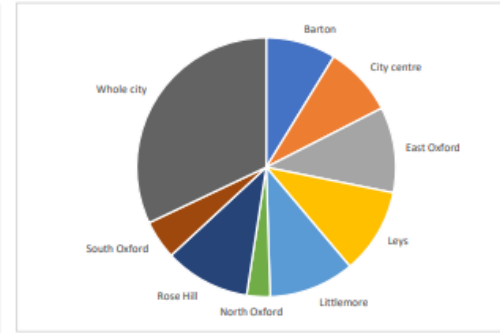

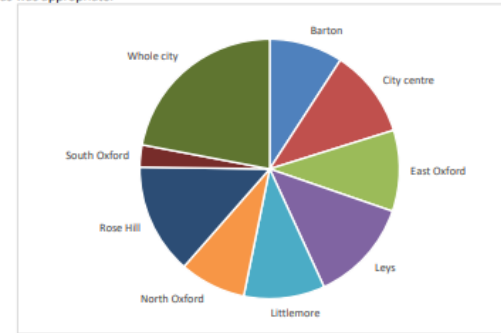
